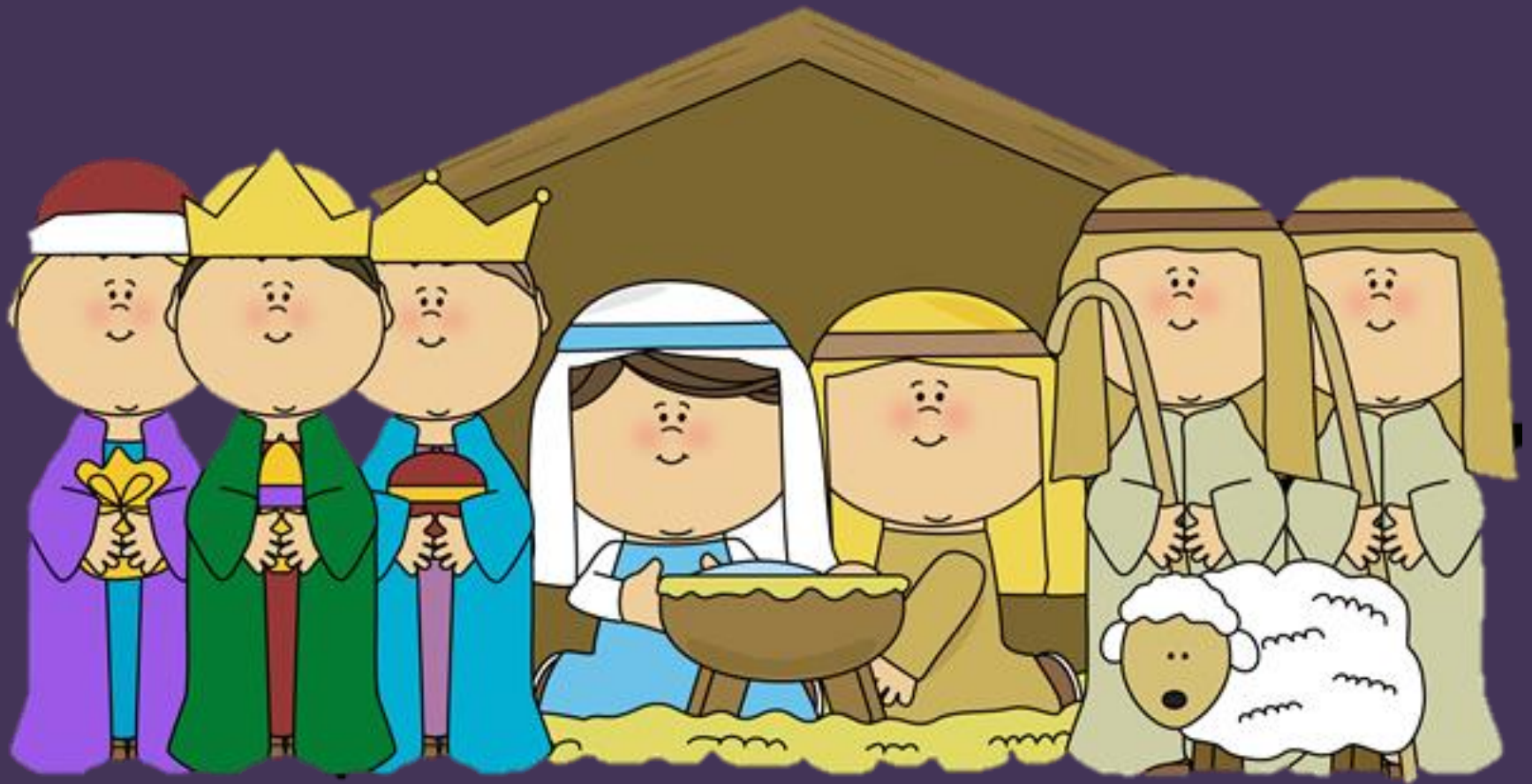

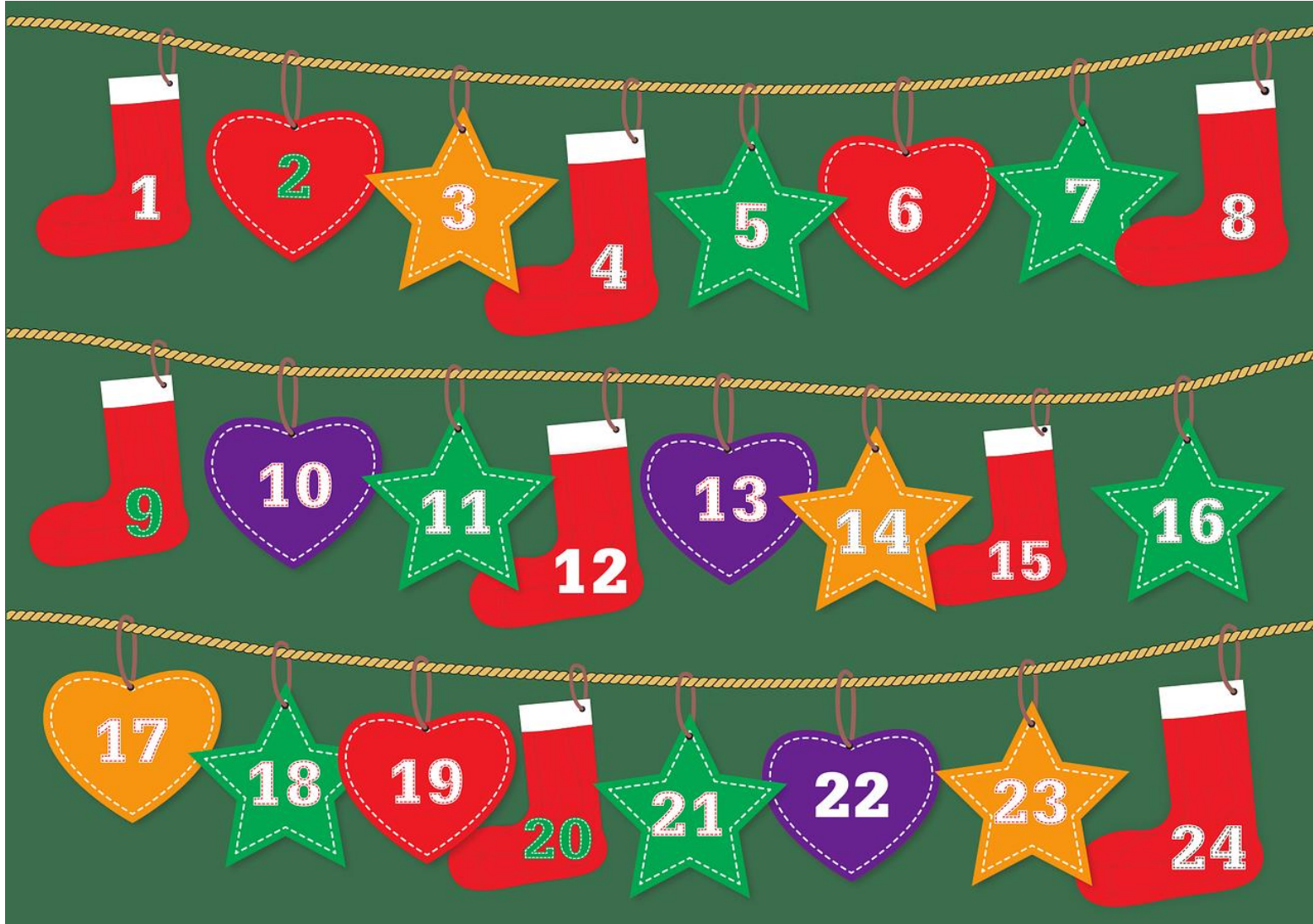

ISAIAH

During the decline of Israel in the shadow of Assyria. He spoke the word of God to those who were "deaf and blind" (see 6:10), who refused to listen to his warnings of looming judgment, yet he also warned that the sin of the people of Judah would bring God's judgement, yet he also said that God is sovereign and would use Cyrus the Persian to return them from exile. The prophet of a "servant," a "man of sorrows," who would be "wounded for our transgressions," and "bearing" God's purposes of salvation (52:13-53:12). The final chapters give a beautiful picture of a new creation in which God will rule as King, judging the wicked and establishing peace. Isaiah prophesied about 740-700 BC (possibly till the 680s).

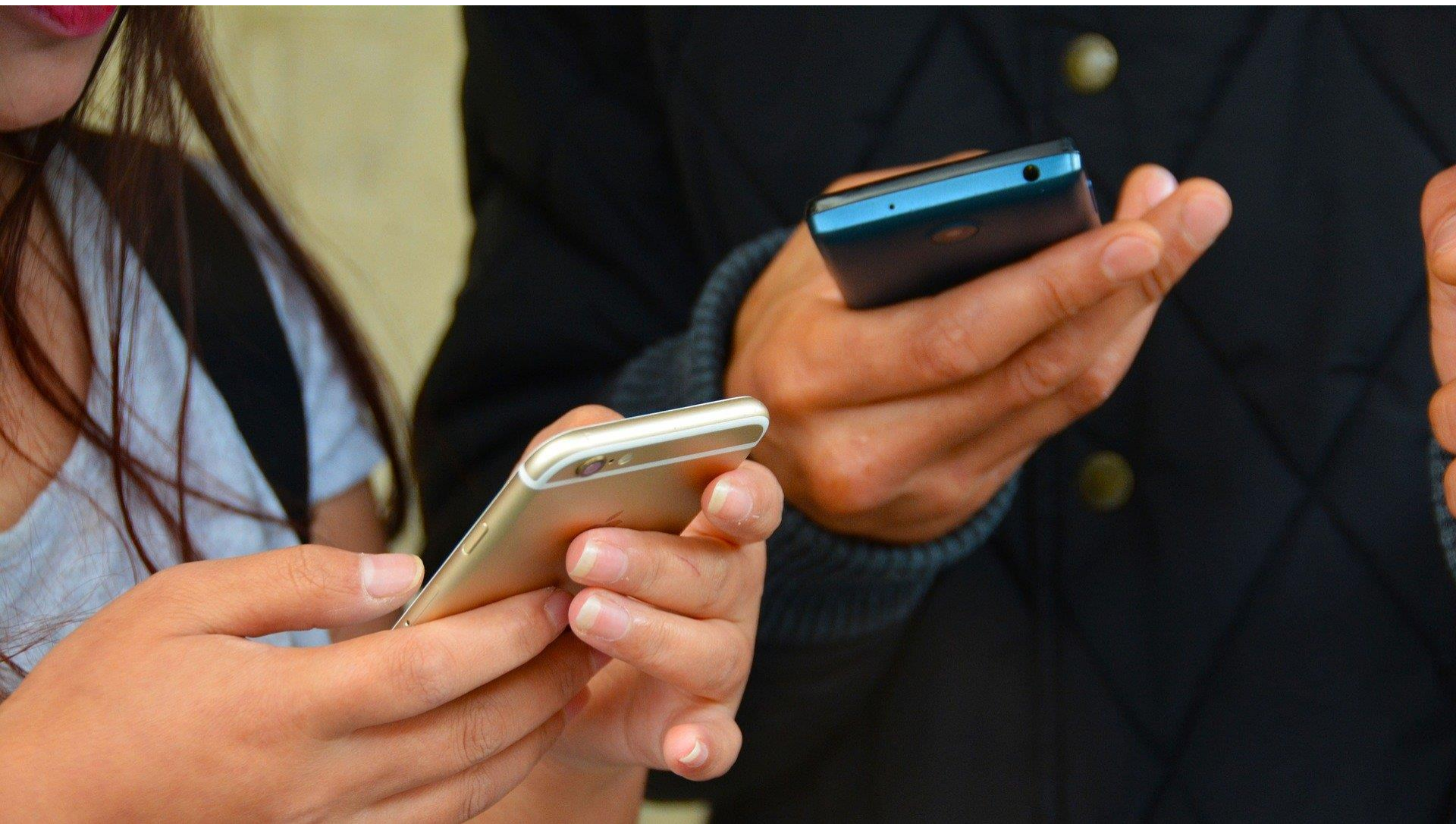
