There is no longer a need to book your seat.

Most of the pews are marked so that there is a 1m distance between rows and withing rows.

Areas marked yellow and black hazard tape to indicate where you cannot sit.

We ask that you remain in your bubbles for seating purposes.

On entry we will ask you to use the QR code to register your attendance if you have a smart phone. If you don't have a smart phone there will be a sheet for you to complete as we are required to enable track and trace.

- The maximum number allowed in the seated part of the Kirk is 110.
- Toilet facilities are to be 'closed' from use.
- Access to the Kirk will be through the front door. If you find that difficult, please let us know and we can arrange to open a side door

## When at church.

Some things to emphasise and remember:

- $\checkmark$  Do use the sanitisers provided at entry points on arrival and exit.
- ✓ Do wear a face covering when inside the building.
- ✓ Offerings will be received at the point of entry/exit in the plates set out for that, there will not be an offering taken in during the service.
- ✓ Do confirm your attendance using the QR code or completing the attendance sheet
- ✓ Do maintain a social distance moving through the building.

Don't sit in areas marked with the yellow and black hazard tape.

Don't use the toilets.

Don't sing without a mask.

Don't stop to chat to people in the building, please leave that for outside and away from the main door.

Our services will continue to be recorded and placed on the website and YouTube during the afternoon.
