A PERSONAL PROFILE

Rev Jo Drew

My former work experience and qualifications have included nursing/care; information work; and horticulture. All of these focused on community or economic development and partnership working.

I also worked for ten years, prior to theological training, as a Project Worker employed by both Catholic and Anglican Church organisations in the Lancaster district and surrounds.

During that time I ran a church community centre; obtained funding; and set up and developed existing projects focusing, in particular, on the homeless and socially isolated older person within Urban Priory Areas.

I also worked for a Church of England rural benefice for two years. I trained at Ripon College, Cuddesdon, Oxford between 2009-2011 as a residential ordinand whilst focusing on the healing ministry with placements in hospitals, hospices, L'Arche and in a children's AIDS hospice and Townships in Bloemfontein, South Africa.

I was ordained Deacon at Rochester Cathedral in September 2011.



A Churchwardens Notes

I'm sorry if some of you were distressed to see that the cherry tree in the pleasance has been pollarded (I know the staff of the pre-school were), but it was infected. The tree surgeons were in last week to cut out the dead wood in the big lime tree and carry out trimming on several other trees. This is just one aspect of a churchwardens duty that Christine Sewell and I do.

I can't believe it is almost 6 months since I became churchwarden and in that time I have found nooks and crannies in Christ Church I didn't know existed and that's only the buildings.

We have had a quinquennial inspection, a five yearly architectural inspection of the buildings by the diocese, (the Buildings and Finance Committee and the PCC are drawing up plans to carry out works required over the next five to ten years).

The heating system has been serviced and a few remedial works identified, which will be carried out hopefully before the full brunt of winter sets in. A churchwardens job is not all about buildings, though this takes a large chunk of time to oversee and without lots of dedicated people who give up their time to keep the buildings looking so good it would take a lot longer, it is about representing the people of the parish in the running of our church; Christ Church.

If you have any questions speak to Christine or I and we will do our best to answer them and if we can't we know someone who can. I feel it is a privilege to serve as a churchwarden and look forward doing my best for Christ Church in the future.
