

People at Christ Church - A PERSONAL PROFILE

Jasmine Humphries

I have been coming to Christ Church for 33 years. I was born in Ashely Down in August 1952.

The youngest child of William and Violet Beaumont. I had an elder brother Ian. I went to Holy Trinity School, which was located next to Holy Trinity Church at the time. My brother and I were part of the choir.

After Holy Trinity Church closed I joined St James Church Choir and then St Georges Church Choir.

My secondary education took place at St Georges School, Gravesend. After I left school in 1969 I began working in foreign banking. It was here that I met my husband Stephen, who is our current Church Treasurer. In 1981 our first son, Stephen, was born and in 1984 our second son, Andrew, was born.

It was around 1990 that I returned to work as a nursery nurse. I worked for 15 years at St Joseph's Convent Prep. School and since 2007 at Ifield School, Gravesend.

Friends felt that I might be a suitable candidate for pastoral care at Christ Church. After my initial apprehension, I began a 2 year course leading to my authorisation as a Pastoral Assistant at Rochester Cathedral in October 2011.

I feel that my calling is towards the bereaved, and I am hoping to join and become involved in the Bereavement Group within our church.

Tree puzzle



On Saturday 29 October 2011 I attended the C of E conference on 'Shrinking the Footprint', held at Bore Place (the home of Common-work - an environmental charity which puts into practice what it preaches).

Bore Place is not the easiest of places to get to, as most of the delegates said as they got out of their cars, yes most had driven to an environmental conference. The first thing that greets you is the aroma of the organic farm and then the cheerful smile of those managing the car park.

The conference was held in the newly refurbished Model Farm Buildings acquired in 1976 by a husband and wife team whose aim was to promote sustainable living. Since 1976 the farm has become fully organic and has developed into a place for people, especially young people, to learn and practice a sustainable living style.

The aim of the conference was to raise awareness about how our carbon footprint (that is the amount of CO2 gas produced by our style of living) should be reduced both as individuals and as a church.

During the morning session talks were presented by a variety of people and organisations including CPRE Protect Kent (Council for the Protection of Rural England), who are supporting the residents of Meopham in their campaign to stop the building of too many houses; Professor Sam Berry who spoke about the Theology in the Bible and its relevance to the environment, and an inspirational talk by Ruth Valerio. Ruth is a writer and environmental activist (or as she describes herself a Christian) living in Chichester. What did I glean from the morning – the speakers were advocating installing solar panels on church roofs, though this was disputed by some who suggested that we should be using less energy and not looking for ways to generate more, Ruth took a more practical line and suggested things like garden share, baskets for vegetables etc. in church porches, and I was nearly persuaded that nuclear power is an environmentally friendly power generating source. Following a wonderful lunch mainly sourced from Bore Place we were given a guided tour around the farm. We saw an organic vegetable plot successfully using permaculture methods which was still full of vegetables for winter use and then had a brief talk on how they had used environmentally friendly building methods to convert the buildings, and visited the wood pellet boilers (something to think about for Christ Church).

The day finished with group work to get us in a mood to produce an action plan, which was photocopied and will be used as a basis for future discussion. The three points on my action plan were: a) Investigating alternatives to the existing gas and oil boilers b) improving The Pleasance, planting trees and investigating rain water harvesting c) investigating the possibility of installing solar panels on the church roof. The day was about looking to the future and how the Church should tackle climate change, but in the meantime I hope with you to look at smaller manageable ways that we can become "Greener" at Christ Church.
