### Through the kitchen door

Easter is upon us and, following Lent, now is the time to treat yourself with a tasty desert.

#### Banoffee Pie with a hint of chocolate

#### Ingredients

- 300 g chocolate digestives
- •100 g butter melted
- •3 large bananas
- •397 g tin of Nestle Carnation caramel condensed milk
- 350 ml double cream (alternatively a mix of thick 'Total' Greek yoghurt and crème fraiche)
- •1 tblspoon icing sugar
- •100 g dark chocolate

#### Method

- 1. Heat the oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4. If cooking the base.
- 2. Crush the biscuits in a food processor then add the melted butter and pulse to combine. This can also be done by placing the biscuits in a strong food bag and bashing with a rolling pin until in crumbs. Then blend with the melted butter in a mixing bowl.
- 3. Press the mixture into a 24 cm tart tin, with a removable base, in an even layer. Transfer the tin to a baking sheet and cook for 10-12 minutes, until lightly toasted and set. Leave to cool then gently release from the tin and put on a serving plate. This can be made without cooking but will need to chill in the refrigerator.
- 4. Spread the caramel over the biscuit base and chill for 1 hour.
- 5. Arrange the banana slices over the caramel. Whip the cream and sugar together to form soft peaks and spread over the bananas. If using the Greek yoghurt and crème fraiche, slightly less indulgent, mix in equal parts and spread over the bananas.
- 6. Melt the chocolate in a microwave or in a bowl set over, not in, a pan of simmering water. Allow to cool slightly, before drizzling over the top.

**Cost?** Who cares we are treating ourselves, but it certainly wont break the bank.



### A Lenten sacrifice

#### What I have given up for Lent?

Well Easter is not too many days away, perhaps the most important time in the Christian calendar.

Not perhaps, but definitely the most important period for Christianity. In Western Christianity Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes on Holy Saturday. The six Sundays in Lent are not counted among the forty days of lent because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter", a celebration of Jesus' victory over sin and death.

Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice to ensure there is a life for us to come after death.

The question for me was what was I to give up this year for Lent?

This is not like a New Year's resolution ready to be broken at any time during the following few weeks, but forty days plus six Sundays of going without something that I love and would miss.

This year I set myself a choice of three that I enjoy most, wine, cake and chocolate. In the end I decided on two of the three, wine and chocolate.

I chose the two that I would miss the most, and if I wasn't drinking or breaking into a bar of 80% chocolate then those around me may need to join in as the cork stayed firmly in the bottle and the wrapper on the bar.

Although I don't take either in excess, the occasional two or three squares of chocolate can give a lift and the extra energy to get a job finished.

On the other side, a glass of good red wine with a meal or when it is time to relax in the evening after a busy day can bring a comfort no other beverage can.

Some may say that Lent is over on Maundy Thursday, but to see it through it is Holy Saturday that is the last day.

When Easter day arrives and we celebrate the risen Christ and the start of a new beginning, the children will have their chocolate eggs to enjoy, but my first enjoyment will be at dinner when I celebrate with a glass of good red wine from the Barossa Valley, Australia.
