

There are heavy grey skies and it's chilly, chilly, chilly, and our naughty little sheep doesn't really feel like getting up this morning. He's tucked up in his bed with just one ear and one little shut eye visible. He's pretending to be asleep, I can tell! I whisper that it's going to be our First Steps service later and he soon rouses himself. He always so looks forward to seeing everybody. It's still cold and grey for our walk up to church with his many friends, but it isn't raining and it's February after all, so what do we expect?

Into church and our naughty little sheep's friends decide that they are going to sit right at the front of the church, by our little altar, so that they can watch the children. Our theme today is Jesus' friends and they want everyone to see that they are our naughty little sheep's friends. His special creatures! When everything is set up, the church doors are opened and first in today are Louisa and her Mum, Lynn and little boy Callan, who is fast asleep in his buggy. They haven't been to First Steps before so it is really nice to welcome them. There are lots of familiar faces, too and our naughty little sheep and his friends are so excited to see everybody.

When everyone is settled, our service begins. Our naughty little sheep and his friend, the glittery dragon, are standing very still on our little altar, as I light the candles. How sensible! Today we're thinking about Jesus' disciples, how he chose them, knowing that they were special people who would help him in his work, spreading the good news of God's love and the promise of His Kingdom. God is calling us to

work on His behalf, too and to show His love in all that we do. We think about the people who are important to us and we thank God for them. We remember that Jesus is our friend who loves us and who died for us on the cross, because of the bad things that we do. The children are being very good, joining in, singing our songs and jingling the jingle bells. Our naughty little sheep is trying not to jiggle too much, just in case but his friends are having a great time.

We sing about how wonderful is Jesus' love, so high you can't get over it, so low you can't get under it, so wide you can't get round it, wonderful, wonderful love!! How amazing to be surrounded by that wonderful love. What a special blessing! And we are also blessed with lovely food to eat, times for fun and laughter and people whom we love and who love us! How very lucky we are!

Everybody is really quiet as we thank God for those blessings and we say the words that Jesus taught us. Then we light some happy candles and some sad candles for special people whom we love and our service is over. Out we all go into the hall for some happy time together, chatting and playing, having a drink and some yummy biscuits. After their refreshments, our naughty little sheep and his friends make themselves comfortable so that they can watch the children play. They do love that! We've had a lovely time together and we hope that everyone will join us again on the 11th March for our next First Steps service, when spring will really be on its way. Hooray!!



Christ Church 200 Club

The 200 Club is a means of raising money for the Christ Church General Fund, which supports the Ministry and Mission of the church and Good Causes as agreed by the PCC, whilst at the same time giving members the opportunity of a small 'flutter' and the chance to win some money.

Membership costs £30 per year. Fifty percent of all monthly donations are given over to the Christ Church General Fund with the remainder being returned to the membership in prize money. The draw is made on the fourth Sunday of every month in the hall after the morning service.

Payment can be made by an annual sum of £30, a quarterly payment of £7.50 or a monthly payment of £2.50, the latter two by bankers order. Cheques should be made payable to Christ Church PCC No 3 account.


Join by contacting John Thrush, in church, and completing an application form. If you are not sure who John is, ask one of the sides people and they will point you in the right direction.

The Mustard Seed is in its second year now, and the next gathering will be on **Thursday 19 March**. You are so welcome.


