# New group to develop sustained increase in vocations

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York have appointed the Bishop of Guildford, Andrew Watson, as chair of the new Vocations Working Group - set up as an outcome from the Resourcing Ministerial Education, RME,report. It will provide stimulus and encouragement for the

Church of England and its dioceses in seeking to widen and deepen the development of vocations to ministry and leadership.

The Vocations Working Group will take forward the output from the consultation process and debate in synod, to develop a medium term strategy to achieve a sustained increase in vocations as a whole. The membership will be drawn from expertise in the Dioceses and regional representatives will also be appointed to help the flow of ideas and create real momentum across the Church.

# SHORNE CHURCH OPEN DAY

Monuments, brasses, old furnishings and medieval architecture are what most visitors are looking for in country churches. St Peter and St Paul at Shorne has all of these. The building has examples of all periods of architecture from Anglo-Saxon to Perpendicular in the 15th century. Unfortunately, like many churches in this area, it is locked when it is not in use.

On Saturday 12th September it will be open from 10 am to 6 pm for anyone to visit and see what it has to offer. In the morning you can guide yourself round using a free leaflet. In the afternoon there will be guided tours at 2, 3 and 4 pm. These are free and there is no need to book. Afternoon teas will be served from 2.30 to 5 pm.

#### 8TH JULY 2015 THE GOOD SHEPHERD

Our naughty little sheep is a bit disappointed to see grey skies when he gets up this morning. It is our First Steps service today and he does love to see the sunshine. The weather still seems changeable as our naughty little sheep. his friends and I walk up to church. There is the odd glimpse of blue sky but those clouds look rather threatening. In we go and the animals make themselves comfortable at the front of the church again. They do so love watching the children, it's their favourite thing, they tell me. Our naughty little sheep and the glittery dragon climb carefully onto our little altar. That is their favourite place, it seems! When everyone is sitting comfortably and we're all ready, I open the doors and we wait to see who will come and join us. Today Chloe is in first, closely followed by Mum Sarah and little brother Jack. It's lovely to see them. Others begin to arrive and soon we have a lovely, lively noisy crowd. Our naughty little sheep and his friends are really pleased to see everyone.

When everybody is settled and the jingle bells are ready, we light our candles and our service begins. We are lighting a very special candle for a very special lady, Katie, who went to be with Jesus two years ago tomorrow. She is very much loved and very much missed and our candle is a reminder of what a bright and beautiful light she was and still remains for all of those who love her.

Today we are thinking about the Good Shepherd. It's a special request from our naughty little sheep. It's one of his favourite Bible stories. He wants us to sing "Baa, Baa Black Sheep" too, and so we do, twice! We hear that Jesus is the Good Shepherd, who loves his sheep very much, indeed; so much that he is prepared to lay down his life to protect them. Isn't that amazing? And he knows them each

by name. If we listen very carefully, we can hear him calling our name, because we are his sheep, too and he is always looking after us. He protects us from anything that would hurt or harm us, helping us to face the difficult times of life.

Our pianist, Anne has taken the day off so we're singing unaccompanied, which is a bit of a challenge! We sing, "My God is so big" and " The Father himself loves you" both of which require lots of arm waving. It's great fun! Our naughty little sheep and his friends are having a lovely time waving their arms about, too. (or is it legs?) It's quite a sight! We thank God for our beautiful world and for His great love for us. We thank Him for coming alongside us in Jesus to be our Good Shepherd. And we sing "Baa, baa black sheep" again for good measure! As usual everyone is very good and quiet for our prayers, as we thank God for bringing us together and for the fun that we are having. Then we say the special prayer that Jesus taught us. Finally we have another special candle to light, this time for new baby Samuel. His Mum Julie has brought him along for the very first time. It is a special "Welcome to the world, little boy" candle! Then with our service at an end, we all go into the hall for time to play, to chat and to have a well earned drink and a biscuit. As usual our naughty little sheep and his friends are at the front of the queue. Then they make themselves

they make themselves comfortable so that they can watch the children play. As always we have had a lovely time together, in spite of the rather changeable weather. Our naughty little sheep whispers that he hopes lots of people will join us on 12th August when we will be having our Teddy Bears' Picnic. We hope that the sun will join us, too!


'We always need volunteers... the church runs because of the generous service of volunteers.

#### PEACE CANDLE IN REMEMBRANCE OF THOSE THAT WENT BEFORE

You may well have seen the 'Peace Candle' that was used at the WW1 commemoration service on 4<sup>th</sup> August, now in the sanctuary. The candle will remain in place throughout the 4 years of commemoration and will be lit at each Sunday and Wednesday service, as a reminder to us all to pray for



peace in the many areas of conflict throughout the world. When you see the candle, please remember to pray for those caught up in conflict.

The sign near to the candle records the areas of conflict most in our prayers at any given time (though there are other 'hidden' conflicts that rarely appear on our televisions). If you would like an area of the world added to the list, please speak to Revs Sue or Jacqueline.


