This phrase is again mentioned by Saint Peter during Pentecost, as recorded in Acts, although Peter says that date, not some future date, was the fulfilment of Joel's prophecy.

A small extract taken form the letter:

"I have great pleasure of informing you that the President of the Repblic has appointed you the rank of Cheavalier in the Ordre national de la Legion a 'honneur.

I offer you my warmest congratulations on this high honour in recognition of your acknowledged military engagement and your steadfast involvement in the Liberation of France during the Second World War".

He goes on to say "As we contemplate this Europe of peace, we must never forget heroes like you who came from Britain and the Commonwealth to begin the liberation of Europe by liberating France. We owe our freedom and security to your dedication because you were ready to risk your life".



We are hoping to get enough copy to enable a different story to be produced in the magazine during the four year anniversary period.



PEACE CANDLE IN REMEMBRANCE OF THOSE THAT WENT BEFORE

You may well have seen the 'Peace Candle' that was used at the WW1 commemoration service on 4th August, now in the sanctuary. The candle will remain in place throughout the 4 years of commemoration and will be lit at each Sunday and Wednesday service, as a reminder to us all to pray for



peace in the many areas of conflict throughout the world. When you see the candle, please remember to pray for those caught up in conflict.

The sign near to the candle records the areas of conflict most in our prayers at any given time (though there are other 'hidden' conflicts that rarely appear on our televisions). If you would like an area of the world added to the list, please speak to Revs Sue or Jacqueline.

Major Parish Churches project undertaken

The Church of England's Church Buildings Council is working with Historic England and other partners to understand what special challenges may face people in managing and caring for this particular

century society. There are more than 200 historic parish churches in England with a floor space of more than 1000m2. However no research has ever been done to try to understand whether there are particular challenges or opportunities that make them harder or easier for their congregations to maintain and sustain than the 14,500 smaller listed places of worship. Historic England, Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF), the Greater Churches Network, the Church Buildings Council and

Doncaster Minster have launched a partnership project to fill this gap in understanding. The project partners will publish the findings from this research in Autumn 2016.

This research will explore the current physical condition and the resources available to maintain, repair, manage and sustain larger historic churches.

It will focus on highly significant buildings used by the community and nation that are expected to provide functions and services beyond those of a typical parish church (civic, cultural, ecclesiastical, tourism, etc.) but only have the resources of a parish church.

Not all large buildings will be involved in the research but a carefully selected sample, representing sites across the country, dating from different periods and serving a range of communities will be invited to take part. A number of other parish churches will also be included, to provide parallel data about buildings of a smaller size.
