Once again thanks to the generosity of Christ Church community a record 64 shoeboxes have been delivered to the Blythswood depot for SE England. The shoeboxes will now be checked, a bible story book or Christian calendar added and the lorry packed for delivery. This year for the first time we know exactly where our shoeboxes will have gone. By the time you read this, the lorry carrying our boxes (and many more) will be on its way to Serbia, where Blythswood have had a presence since 2002. Some of our boxes will be given to the families of refugees from the Balkan Wars as they have for many years, but although most of these have now become integrated into Serbian life, many are still living in extreme poverty.

The second group of boxes will go to Syrian refugee camps.



As you open your presents on Christmas Day, spare a thought for the children and adults fortunate enough to receive a Blythswood Shoebox and the JOY that will bring.





MRS FINCH - Church Caretaker



Peter Shearan has published a book with the above title about a real-life lady who acted as church caretaker in Christ Church one hundred years ago. Her life began in 1835, when King William IV was on the British throne, and when stage coaches were a common sight passing through Gravesend; through the Great War; and only ended when she died at the age of 85, by which time she had witnessed many of the marvels of today's life (aeroplanes, motor cars and buses, and electric light to name only a few). Peter has woven the tale of what he has found to have been a remarkable woman around all the known facts: through doing so he has come to know her well (although he wishes he had known her personally!). His book will be on sale from the end of November, price £10. All proceeds from the sale will be going towards a planned commemoration of WWI in Autumn 2016.

The only German to escape from Britain

Gunther Plüschow (February 8, 1886 – January 28, 1931) was a German aviator, aerial explorer and author from Munich, Bavaria. His feats include the only escape by a German prisoner of war in World War One from Britain back to Germany;

Escape from London

On May 1, 1915, Plüschow was sent to a prisoner of war camp in Donington Hall in Leicestershire. On July 4, 1915, he escaped during a storm and headed for London. Scotland Yard issued an alert, asking the public to be on the lookout for a man with a "dragon tattoo" on his arm. Disguised as a worker, Plüschow felt safe enough to take souvenir photographs of himself at the London docks. He occupied his time by reading books about Patagonia, and at night he hid inside the British Museum.

For security reasons, no notices were published announcing the departure of ships, but a lucky encounter with another of his lady friends allowed him to obtain the information to board the ferry Princess Juliana, sailing for the neutral Netherlands. He arrived safely and finally reached Germany, where he was at first arrested as a spy since no one believed he could have accomplished such a feat. To this date Plütschow is the only German combatant during the two World Wars to escape a prison camp in the British Isles.

Return to Germany

Once he was identified, Plüschow was acclaimed as "the hero from Tsingtau". He was decorated, promoted, and



assigned command of the naval base at Libau in occupied Latvian Courland. In June 1916, in an airplane hangar at Libau, Plüschow married. He also wrote his first book, The Adventures of the Aviator from Tsingtau, which sold more than 700,000 copies. In 1918, his son, Guntolf Plüschow, was born.

1918 was a year of profound crisis in Germany. In November, Wilhelm II, German Emperor, was forced to flee to the Netherlands as his nation dissolved into chaos. In 1919, the Treaty of Versailles was imposed on Germany by her victorious enemies, and several military and civil revolts took place. Kapitänleutnant [lieutenant commander] Plüschow refused to participate. Instead, at age 33, he reluctantly resigned from the Reichsmarine.

FROM RECENT EDITION OF "IN REVIEW"

Resourcing Ministerial Education: Future Funding Model for training ordinands

The original 12 proposals presented at Synod in February 2015 have been revised significantly in the light of the consultation earlier this year with

dioceses and Theological Education Institutions (TEIs). Further consultation with dioceses and TEIs on the revised proposals is now taking place, with a view to

recommendations reaching the House of Bishops and Archbishops' Council in December.

A report is expected to be presented at Synod in February 2016, with a view to implementation from September 2017.

Growing Vocations

Following a review of Diocesan vocations resources, a new working group chaired by the Bishop of Guildford, Andrew Watson, has concluded that greater support would increase


candidate numbers. A plan is now being developed across dioceses to encourage vocations opportunities with a particular focus on the Church of England Ministry Experience Scheme (CEMES).

Facilitating Lay Leadership

In September the Archbishops' Council established a working group on lay leadership reflecting the desire nationally to increase participation by lay members of the Church. The group is chaired by Matthew Frost, a lay member of Archbishops' Council and will report back in September 2016.

Nurturing and Discerning Future Leaders

The main themes of this work are developing confident leaders and evangelists and collaborative teams, both lay and ordained: refinina management skills oversee resources. structures and people; and developing a diverse pool of those who may be called to posts of wider responsibility in the future.



Launch of Character Education report

There is no such thing as a neutral education, states a discussion paper published by the Church of England, which explores what character education should look like in schools.

The paper, from the national education office, also suggests that development of character must be far more than the traditional virtues of grit and resilience – essential though these maybe - and should see the development of intellectual. spiritual, moral and physical attributes as equally essential. It adds that education is not just about producing increasingly efficient economic units: it is about developing people who can flourish in all areas of their lives. Speaking at the conference on character education, the Bishop of Ely, Stephen Conway, Chair of the Board of Education said: "We need an expanded and expansive vision which does not restrict our hardwon freedoms but which invites us to be committed fellow citizens of developed character and loving purpose."
