Rosary Basilica

The Basilica of our Lady of the Rosary (French: Notre Dame du Rosaire de Lourdes) is a Roman Catholic church and minor basilica within the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes in France. Its main theme is a celebration and depiction of the Rosary.



The Rosary Basilica is the third of the churches to be completed on the site (after the Crypt and the Upper Basilica). It was designed by architect Leopold Hardy and completed in 1899. It was consecrated in 1901 and has a capacity of 1,500 worshippers. Its style is influenced by Byzantine architecture.

In 2006-7 the interior and exterior of the basilica were extensively renovated and the mosaics (many of which were deteriorating) were restored.

FIRST STEPS

10TH FEBRUARY 2016
ASH WEDNESDAY
LENT BEGINS.

Our naughty little sheep isn't up quite as early as usual this morning. He tells me that he doesn't feel like rushing out of bed because it feels chilly and the sky looks grey outside. But when I remind him that it's our First Steps service this afternoon, he cheers up immediately. The morning flies by and soon it's time for him, his friends and I to make our way up to church. Though it is still cloudy there are flashes of sunshine and the daffodils and pansies in the church garden look lovely. They've been out for ages and they're still going strong. Our naughty little sheep tells me that the teeny daffs are his favourites and I have to agree. The miracle of nature is all around us.

In church everyone gets comfortable in their special places as I get things ready. Linda and Jan are slaving away in the hall, too, getting out the toys and preparing the refreshments. 

Everyday is a blessing for us, filled with miracles for us to appreciate and enjoy.

When we have said our prayers and our candles have been blown out, it's time to go into the Hall to have some playing time and some chatting time, with a biscuit and a cuppa. As usual our naughty little sheep and his friends rush out to be at the front of the queue. You'd never think that it's Lent! They tell me that they're all going to be good from tomorrow. I fear that it may always be tomorrow! Still they love watching the children play and the Mums, Grandmas and Dad CT chatting. It's quality time! What more could anyone ask? They hope that everyone will come again for our next First Steps service on the 9th March when Spring really will be on the way. Hooray!





FROM RECENT EDITION OF “IN REVIEW”

General Synod opens with Archbishop Justin reflecting on Primates' Meeting

Addressing Synod, Archbishop Justin spoke about the Primates' Gathering and Meeting held in Canterbury in January which he said had 'occasioned much comment and even more misrepresentation'.

"We were conscious as we met in that week that literally millions, possibly tens of millions, of people were praying for us, and I have never known a week in which I have been so aware of prayer, or of pressure."

He also explained how the Primates decided on the consequence of the American Episcopal Church (TEC) altering its definition of marriage to be gender neutral. The Presiding Bishop of TEC, Michael Curry, described the Primates' decision as a fair outcome, Archbishop Justin added.

Summing up he said: "If we bring to our Church, and to the world around, the certainty that Jesus came to set us free, and to open the way for true human flourishing in service to each other and to Him; if our expectation in that only in foot

washing, even of our enemies, is the Truth demonstrated adequately, then in beauty of relationship the grace of God will prevail, as that grace did during the Primates' Meeting "Life will not be perfect, or even anything remotely approaching it. That kind of over-realised eschatology is a nonsense. There are no quick fixes, magic wands or perfect spells. There is no church order that ensures perfection, nor one in which human sin does not add to the problems of the whole.

"Yet there is a way forward that reveals the unity that we are given, and that celebrates the strength that we can bring each other; that enables us to love those who oppose us, and that focuses on human flourishing and on the setting free those who are bound by rules which Jesus could never have imagined, nor Paul...and which have emerged out of a desire for power rather than the expectation of the kingdom of God. There is, in short, a way forward in which we look like the people of Christ."

MRS FINCH - Church Caretaker



Peter Shearan has published a book with the above title about a real-life lady who acted as church caretaker in Christ Church one hundred years ago. Her life began in 1835, when King William IV was on the British throne, and when stage coaches were a common sight passing through Gravesend; through the Great War; and only ended when she died at the age of 85, by which time she had witnessed many of the marvels of today's life (aeroplanes, motor cars and buses, and electric light to name only a few). Peter has woven the tale of what he has found to have been a remarkable woman around all the known facts: through doing so he has come to know her well (although he wishes he had known her personally!). His book is on sale now, price £10.

All proceeds from the sale will be going towards a planned commemoration of WWI in Autumn 2016.
