PENTECOST Breathe on me breath of God

One thing we've all learnt in recent years is just how potent our breath can be. Something so basic, an essential part of our existence has suddenly taken on a new significance. Normally we are aware of each other's breathing only when we get close – not least on public transport or a crowded situation. Breath carries life – even if it is a life destroying virus. Breath is potent.



In Genesis God breathes the breath of life into clay to make Adam, in Ezekiel the valley of dry bones is animated brought to life by God's breath, in John's Gospel the disciples receive the Holy Spirit on Easter Day when Jesus breathes on them in the upper room. The ancient oriental churches still use breath as well as the laying on of hands as part of the ordination service.

Breathe on me breath of God fill me with life anew



On the day of Pentecost the disciples were filled with the Spirit – the breath of God. They were occupied, possessed, saturated, infected. They became unlikely voices who spoke a remarkable word.

They are accused of being drunk. The freshness of their words is an explosive wine, not containable in old wine skins, making demands, sparking and exhilarant, offering new words, new language, new meaning. It is God's Spirit who works through them, who enables communication to happen. Unlike a drunk, Peter is able to speak eloquently

about the significance of what is happening.

Pentecost does not make the churches' leaders showmen, performing miracles and tricks to gain public attention. The Holy Spirit is not a power to be manipulated. The Holy Spirit frees us, Christ's peace gives heart and courage to those who are open to the leading of the Spirit making us participants in God's mission, agents of God's intervention in human life.

For us Pentecost is not some weird supernatural phenomenon but the door to an everyday possibility that God will work in and through us. The Holy Spirit should help us to be attentive to the accents and stories of others — Gravesend as we know is complicated (increasingly a place of many tongues) but we are called by this foundational story to allow the Holy Spirit to orientate our hearts and minds to those who are different, to strangers, that together we might learn to speak of the spaciousness of the Kingdom. In the words of St Paul: To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

Gaia

ROCHESTER CATHEDRAL 24TH MAY - 12TH JUNE 2022



If you loved the 'Museum of the Moon', you won't want to miss Luke Jerram's 'Gaia' arriving at Rochester Cathedral in May 2022.

Measuring seven metres in diameter, *Gaia* features 120dpi detailed NASA imagery of the Earth's surface*. The artwork provides the opportunity to see our planet on this scale, floating in three-dimensions.

The installation creates a sense of the *Overview Effect*, which was first described by author Frank White in 1987. Common features of the experience for astronauts are a feeling of awe for the planet, a profound understanding of the interconnection of all life, and a renewed sense of responsibility for taking care of the environment.

The artwork also acts as a mirror to major events in society. In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, the artwork may provide the viewer with a new perspective of our place on the planet; a sense that societies of the Earth are all interconnected and that we have a responsibility toward one another. After the lockdown, there has been a renewed respect for nature.

A specially made surround sound composition by BAFTA award winning Composer Dan Jones is played alongside the sculpture. In Greek Mythology Gaia is the personification of the Earth.

Hope for a Gaia in Crisis - Tools for faith-filled resilient living Dr Ruth Valerio, will be speaking on 'Hope for a Gaia in Crisis - Tools for faith-filled resilient living 'on Wednesday 8th June. Dr Valerio is the Canon Theologian at Rochester Cathedral.
