### **Reading: Matthew Chapter 16 v 13 – 20 GNB Peter's Declaration about Jesus**

<sup>13</sup> Jesus went to the territory near the town of Caesarea Philippi, where he asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?"

<sup>14</sup> "Some say John the Baptist," they answered. "Others say Elijah, while others say Jeremiah or some other prophet."

<sup>15</sup> "What about you?" he asked them. "Who do you say I am?"

<sup>16</sup> Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

<sup>17</sup> "Good for you, Simon son of John!" answered Jesus. "For this truth did not come to you from any human being, but it was given to you directly by my Father in heaven. <sup>18</sup> And so I tell you, Peter: you are a rock, and on this rock foundation I will build my church, and not even death will ever be able to overcome it. <sup>19</sup> I will give you the keys of the Kingdom of heaven; what you prohibit on earth will be prohibited in heaven, and what you permit on earth will be permitted in heaven."

<sup>20</sup> Then Jesus ordered his disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.

### **Reflection on the Word**

After years of ministry in Israel, Jesus sent His disciples to circulate among the crowds in Caesarea Philippi (CP) and listen to what people were saying about him. The people were reported to be full of praise for Jesus and identified him with some Old Testament great. CP, however, was a Greco-Roman worship centre with temples to various gods. It is when confronted by the variety of worship styles and temples – a riot of noise, colour and chaos – that Jesus asks the disciples the all-important question "Who do people say I am? "

Just before this story Jesus had cautioned his disciples about the Jewish leaders themselves, Pharisees & Sadducees. Now they are in the religious melting pot of pagan cults – for Jewish disciples, a shocking place. And yet it is in this murky confusing cauldron that Peter responds in a new way to Jesus. People say all sorts of things but Peter recognises Jesus for who He is.

So the people were full of praise for Jesus but it was faint praise. Faint praise indeed. It's as if you or I looked at portrait by Rembrandt or Leonardo da Vinci and commented "Oh, it's a nice picture."

Faint praise and lukewarm support are almost worse than the open hostility of the religious leaders of the day. And it's often the same today. "Oh, Jesus is alright. He was a good man - a wonderful teacher. There's a lot we can learn from Jesus – too bad he was crucified and died before his time."

People can respect Jesus as a good person but God calls us to acknowledge Jesus as Lord and Saviour. Nothing less than worshipping Him as Son of God will do.

## **Questions**

So back to Caesarea Philippi. Jesus did not send out His disciples because He was curious about what the crowds thought. He sent them out to listen so that they would be forced to make a decisive personal decision.

- a. You see it doesn't matter what other people say about Jesus. It doesn't matter if our parents, children, friends or our whole family are Christians, or indeed if they are not. Each one of us must answer for ourselves the question Jesus asked His followers then and asks us today. "Who do you say that I am?"
- b. Jesus also gave Peter the keys of the Kingdom, a privilege and a responsibility. These keys, this responsibility is now passed on to us. How do we feel about that?

- c. Jesus hands the responsibility of opening access to God to the Church. The keys which are handed down give the church permission to innovate, to unlock doors that were firmly closed and show just how far the mercy of God will stretch when given the chance. How do you think this will work now?

The keys held by Peter though are not physical but very much spiritual. Spiritually we who say "You are the Christ, Son of the living God" are custodians of the keys to the Kingdom and through our thoughts words and actions on a daily basis we form part of the rock on which God's church is built. The keys are a privilege, a responsibility and a challenge to us all in our daily walk with Jesus, Son of the living God. **Amen.**
