Welcome to Trinity!

We give a warm welcome to regulars and visitors alike. If you are new among us do make yourself known to us and ask for a copy of our Welcome Pack.

This morning's service will last around an hour. We worship together with our children and young people for the first part of the service and then they will leave for their own activities - if you are not sure where to go, follow the crowd out to the middle hall and someone will direct you to the right group. Crèche facilities for under-3s are available in the back hall throughout the service.

Tea and coffee will be served in the middle hall after the morning service – everyone is welcome to stay for fellowship.

An audio loop system is installed downstairs, for anyone wearing a suitable hearing aid.

An offering will be collected during the service. Visitors, please do not feel obliged to contribute, this is for regular friends and members to give to the life of the church.

The Point is our evening service which starts at 7.00 pm and will last around an hour. The Point is a more informally styled service.

If you would like someone to pray with you after either service, this is available in the chapel – look for the sign near the front by the worship team, or look for people with prayer ministry team badges.

Several small groups meet during the week on various days and in various locations. There is a list of all small groups on the notice board in the welcome area, or speak to Andy Banks.

New Childcare Arrangements for Church Meeting

We have decided to trial a new system to improve the arrangements for childcare during church meetings, so that we know exactly which children are staying around and can keep them safe. This is both to improve our safeguarding of children and health and safety arrangements (should there be a fire for example).

Parents of children aged up to 18 are now requested to ensure that their children are registered with the supervising adults upstairs in the lounge, before going into the church meeting (YP who are staying in the building are permitted to register themselves at their parents' discretion, but should also remain upstairs). There will then still be the opportunity for the children to watch a DVD or do some craft in the lounge or play football in the upper hall. Parents or carers will then be required to collect their child(ren) from the upstairs hall as soon as possible after the end of the church meeting. (Note: Children of YP age will be released to leave without being collected, once the adults in charge know that the church meeting has finished).

Adults who are not attending the church meeting or looking after the children will not be allowed access to the upstairs rooms whilst the church meeting is in place. If there are any queries or questions please see Nikki Hall.
