For Your Prayers

- Praise God that it seems that we have exceeded 2019/20 budgeted income by approximately £5.2k! This provides us a welcome cushion to potentially offset against the unknown effect of COVID-19 on our church finances.
- Continue to pray for all those have been, and are continuing to be, affected by COVID-19. We pray for those who are particularly fearful
 and lonely at moment. We pray for the most vulnerable and isolated in our neighbourhoods. We pray for the medical staff on the front line
 of care and we pray for the government and all those leading the response to COVID-19 across the world.
- Pray for those whose work or income is affected or under threat by coronavirus and pray for Evergreen who are struggling to maintain their work supporting the elderly in our borough, despite it being more needed than ever.
- Pray for Christians and their communities throughout India during their lockdown. There has been remarkable growth in new churches in rural India over the last couple of decades but there has also been an increase in hostility from militant Hindus towards churches and Christians. Pray for their protection, provision and the opportunity to witness and serve during this crisis.

Church Finances

In the light of the fact that we are unable to meet, and given the financial constraints outlined in the budget, we would ask those who normally give to the church through the weekly offering (either through the envelope scheme or in cash), to seriously consider giving by bank transfer instead.
