As we begin 2021, I want to wish you all a happy, healthy and blessed new year. 2020 was an incredibly difficult year, which stretched us all individually in one way or another and brought considerable challenges for us as a church too, but God has carried us through it all. I want to thank everyone who has prayed, worshipped, preached, welcomed, taught and prepared children's materials, played, sung, produced our online and live-streamed services, ran Zoom meetings, visited people, cooked for people, supported buddies, and many other jobs we never envisioned at the beginning of 2020, but which have enabled us to meet virtually and in person throughout the year. I also want to thank the diaconate, who have willingly and sacrificially shouldered a huge burden of collective decision-making during this unprecedented year.

2021 begins with some hope - the Oxford vaccine was passed for use beginning on Monday - but also with considerable difficulty, as a more virulent strain of Covid sweeps across the country. We may well be in for a few more rough months together before we really start to see some improvements. But as Christians, our hope does not rest solely on scientific advances, nor on the excellent care of our NHS. As I shared in our Watchnight service, our hope for this life and the next rests ultimately in Jesus Christ, in whom is life, which is the light of all people. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:4-5). We have seen this over the last year, not least in some wonderful answers to prayers for healing, and I believe we can see it all the more in 2021. Our God is greater than this darkness - nothing and no-one can extinguish his life-light in his world. We are called to be his witnesses, and I pray we will increasingly have the courage to be so in 2021. Therefore, "let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith." Andy.
