Pastor's Message

Last week, David Linley began his sermon by reading from the start of Psalm 42. Psalms 42 and 43 are one psalm in the Hebrew Bible, and together they make for a very interesting read. The Psalmist seeks to encourage himself to put his faith in God to counteract his very real feelings of depression and despair, the cause of which is unstated. The refrain appears three times:

"Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me?

Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Saviour and my God." Yet, in the very next verse from the verses David read comes the reality check: "My soul is downcast within me" (v.6, emphasis mine). The Psalmist knows that he will find no relief from his pain unless he acknowledges the truth of it. Indeed, as these Psalms progress the pain is expressed more and more forcefully. But equally, his expressions of faith in God become stronger too, as he addresses his pain with the truth of who God is. As we look out into an unimaginable statistic of in excess of 100,000 Covid deaths, there is a place for mourning and lament, and even for questions and doubt about our faith. The Psalmist shows us what best to do with those feelings and questions: we take them directly to God himself and allow the firm truths of his word to quicken our faith even in the midst of them. I commend these Psalms for your meditation this week.
