Pastor's Message

This week marked a year since the start of the first UK Covid-lockdown. The figures are staggering and deeply tragic. 126,445 UK Covid deaths to date. More than 4.3 million UK confirmed cases, some, including within our own fellowship, with continuing effects on their health. Each of these individuals is a person, with family and friends who are also affected. And this is before we consider the spiritual, mental, physical, educational and economic effects of isolation, lockdown, closed schools and universities, trauma and overwork for our emergency services, and so forth. How can we begin to make sense of such pain and loss? Where can we turn to help us have faith in the midst of it all?

One resource within the Bible is the many laments in books like the Psalms and Lamentations. Although written in different contexts, and therefore including different details, we can discover something of how to express our sorrow, or even anger, to God, and how to find hope in the midst of it all. For instance, Lamentations 3 begins somewhat shockingly:

*"I am the one who has seen affliction
by the rod of the LORD's wrath.
He has driven me away and made me walk
in darkness rather than light;
indeed, he has turned his hand against me
again and again, all day long." (Lam 3:1-3)*

We might want to defend God against such an accusation, but God himself has seen fit to include this in his Word. The correctness or not of the theology is not so important as the ability to express how it feels. That expression enables the writer to later state:

*"Yet this I call to mind
and therefore I have hope:
Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed,
for his compassions never fail.
They are new every morning;
great is your faithfulness.
I say to myself, 'The LORD is my portion;
therefore I will wait for him.'
The LORD is good to those whose hope is in him,
to the one who seeks him;
it is good to wait quietly
for the salvation of the LORD." (Lam 3:21-26)*

In case we think lament is only an Old Testament practice, we might also take another look at Jesus on the cross, crying out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46, quoting Psalm 22:1). The purpose of lament is to express our pain honestly to God and to leave the solution at his door. The beginning of Holy Week may be a good opportunity to pause and to lament what has happened this last year, and through that process to allow God to minister to our pain.
