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Pastor's Message

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favour of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved." Acts 2:42-47

Most of you will know by now that I believe this short summary of the early days of the first Church provide us with a wonderful insight into what the Church should strive to become. I have stated before that I see in this passage nine specific features of church life, namely:

- Solid biblical teaching
- Genuine fellowship
- Praise and worship, particularly focused around communion
- Prayer, especially corporate prayer
- Space and openness for the Holy Spirit to work
- Generous and sacrificial giving
- A good name amongst
- A clear missional and evangelistic focus
- Pastoral care for existing members

Today, I don't want to say any more about those features. I simply want to draw your attention again to the first words of this passage: "They devoted themselves to ..." To devote oneself to something is to give up oneself wholly to it. So, I want to suggest a couple of questions that I believe are good for each of us to ask ourselves: 1) "What does devotion to these priorities look like in the current situation?" and 2) "How has the covid pandemic either enhanced or lessened our devotion to these priorities?" If our devotion has waned in any way, now is a good time to act to rekindle it. The result of the first Christians' devotion to these things was that "the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved." What might God do among us, if we are similarly devoted?
