Pastor's Message

"Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, 'Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest.'" Mark 6:31

Rest is not always celebrated in our culture. We may go away on holiday, but many of us will take our mobile phones or our laptops with us and check in with work emails during our holiday. But rest – full, proper rest – is central to the biblical view of life. From the beginning of creation, God established the principle of a Sabbath rest from work each week, since he rested from his work of creation on the seventh day. Equally, as the Israelites' covenant relationship with God developed, there were built into their years prolonged periods of rest and celebration, such as the week-long Feast of Unleavened Bread (which included the Passover), and the Festival of Tabernacles.

Further, there were times when God called individuals to rest when they had faced particularly stressful situations or were worn out. Elijah was a case in point in 1 Kings 19. Likewise, in the passage above, Jesus called his disciples away with him to rest. But in every case, the rest God envisages is a rest with him. It is to recharge our batteries in communion with him. After the huge strains of the last year, I believe we all need something of this proper rest (I know I do!). So, I pray that you will each, in your own way, be able to take some rest with God over the summer months, such that we can all be refreshed for God's service again in the Autumn.
