# "I told you I was ill" (Spike Milligan's epitaph)



Dear friends, I hope you're ready to do some work, because I'm going to set you a challenge. It's based on one that Heather, Eileen and I were set on a Local Pastors training course, the first we've ever had – yes, up until now we've been making it up as we went along – oh, you'd guessed that, had you?

Anyway, on to the challenge - you'll need a pen and two small pieces of paper. So here's the first part of the challenge? Write down, in a maximum of eight words, an epitaph for yourself, which might be honest, but isn't necessarily kind. To give you an idea of what I mean, mine might be

"Tried hard but failed. Dodgy sense of humour".

You don't have to follow that style – it might be just one feature of you or up to eight single words describing different facets of your character. Be honest about what you say, and you can be as critical as you like, because nobody else is going to see it.

OK, on to the second part. Write down, again in a <u>maximum</u> of eight words, an epitaph for yourself that you wouldn't mind actually seeing on your headstone. Yes, I know, you won't be around to actually see it, but you know what I mean. It still has to be honest, you can't big yourself up to something that isn't true, but get rid of any negativity. Again, to give you an idea of what I mean, mine might be *"He loved his family and shared God's love"*. I'd be happy if that were my actual epitaph – but you need to work out your own, in your own style, in your own words. Take a minute to think about it and write it down before you read any further.

OK, if you're ready, take the first piece of paper – and tear it up into a thousand pieces, burn it, throw it in the bin, feed it to next door's cat. Do whatever you need to do to get rid of it, expunge it, consign it to the dustbin of history. Why? Because that is not who you are! In Robert Burns' poem "To a mouse", are the words (anglicised for you) "Oh would the Lord, the power he give us, to see ourselves as others see us".

Now take the second piece of paper – this is the one you'd actually be comfortable having on your headstone (though not yet, please God, not yet). Stick it on your fridge, or your Noticeboard, or wherever you'll see it frequently, as a reminder that this is how God sees you. He sees the best of you, the potential of you, the person you can be, with his help.

For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them. (Ephesians 2 v 10)


## **Advent Bible Study**
