Lifespring Lifecycle

How is your progress? Are you progressing through your lifecycle at Lifespring?


The first step is to have a real encounter with God. That encounter can only take place through genuine repentance (change of mind leading to a change of behaviour) and saving Faith in Jesus' love and forgiveness towards you. So your life as a Christian starts by encountering and loving God.

Then you progress to meeting and loving fellow believers. We believe this is best done in small groups. We call them Life Groups. This is where you will be guided in your walk with the Lord (called Discipleship).

You then progress from loving fellow believers to loving people in your community. We can do this effectively by becoming involved in ministry. You can teach and preach, lead a small group; you can work at the cafe or at Turnaround; you can become involved in Administration, Parent and Toddler, the Youth Club or Make Lunch, Boys Brigade. These are real opportunities for you to show love to people in our community.

For the sake of the growth of the Church, it is very important to bring as many people as possible into "ministry". Billy Graham said that for every one Christian that comes into ministry (service) four people join the Church. We don't know how that happens; but we know it does! It seems to be a spiritual principle.

Over the next two years, we will be encouraging our Church to move along from one stage of your lifecycle to the next. Get ready for the journey! It's going to be exciting.



Welcome to Stephen Hevey Sunday 2nd June



Stephen will be speaking at both venues on Sunday 2nd June. He is married to Aishling and they have four children - Aaron, Caleb, Lauren and Ruthann. He comes originally from Dublin but now lives in Carmarthen in South Wales.

Stephen has an amazing testimony of God's grace and he loves to minister and teach on the grace of God.

He didn't have a very promising start to life. He was born into a family of 10 children in a one bedroom flat and grew up on the streets of Dublin that were ravaged by heroin addiction. He started taking heroin and became addicted from a very young age. He ended up homeless and lived under a tree in a park for some years. His daily routine was begging just to say alive.

He was literally a mess and he tried ending his life several times. Then one day, totally by chance, he walked into a prayer meeting in a church and heard about the love of God. At that point, God began to change his mess into a message, as Barry Woodward would say.

He went to Teen Challenge and there felt the call of God to be an Evangelist. He worked as the field director of Teen Challenge for a number of years but his ministry has mostly been lay preaching.

Stephen is coming to Lifespring to proclaim a message that if he can change, anyone can change and stay changed.

As we prepare for this weekend with Stephen and Aishling, please remember that Stephen's visit isn't really about you and me! It's about those people we may know who do not yet know God and who need to know that God can transform their mess. Let's make it about them.
