Dear Friends,

This edition of our Magazine encourages us to have faith, and not fear. We know what happens when we get anxious, worried or fearful, we lose our focus and clear thinking. Things seem out of shape and can feel overwhelming. It is a different story, when we are in a calmer state of mind. This is highlighted in the story from Matthew's Gospel 14 v 25 – 33 of Jesus walking on the water and the response of the distressed disciples.

The boat was in the water, some distance from land, buffeted and pushed around by waves and wind. Deep in the night, when Jesus had concluded His prayers, Jesus walked out on the water to His disciples in their boat. The disciples saw a figure moving toward them and were terrified. Disciple: It's a ghost! Another Disciple: A ghost? What will we do? Jesus: Be still. It is I. You have nothing to fear. Peter: Lord, if it is really You, then command me to meet You on the water. Jesus: Indeed, come. Peter stepped out of the boat onto the water and began walking toward Jesus. But when he remembered how strong the wind was, his courage caught in his throat and he began to sink. Peter: Master, save me! Immediately Jesus reached for Peter and caught him. Jesus: O you of little faith. Why did you doubt and dance back and forth between following Me and heeding fear? Then Jesus and Peter climbed in the boat together, and the wind became still. And the disciples worshiped Him. Truly You are the Son of God.

The disciples are shocked at Jesus' presence on the water. Their minds find it difficult to process what they see, Jesus on the water, but without a boat. Peter, spontaneous as usual, asks Jesus if he can try walking on the water himself. While he focuses on Jesus, Peter is able to achieve all that he wants to, just like Jesus is able to do. When he becomes distracted by the wind and waves his focus transfers to his fears and he asks Jesus to

save him, because he is sinking. Jesus immediately gives his hand to support Peter, and they get back into the boat. The other disciples breathe a sigh of relief and release as everyone is safe. The wind calms and everyone regains their composure. At this point, they acknowledge that Jesus is the Son of God. This is the only response they can make to what has happened. Only God has power over creation. Everything has returned to normal, and the relationship between Jesus and his disciples has deepened. Jesus reminds them that their faith is required, in order for people to see the true example to follow.

In this time of lock-down and forced isolation, we have experienced fear or confusion about all manner of things that never bothered us before. We have also been surprised at the things that we have little patience for. Our connection to God has become increasingly important. Just as Peter puts his trust in Jesus, we have relied on our loving God to sustain and care for us. We have to take God at God's word, "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 8:38 – 39.

We have lived through unprecedented times, during the last 6 months. We have had to rely on the support of people; friends, family and even strangers for their compassion and care. We have also renewed our faith in God and have been surprised at the small things that have made us smile, and felt loved. Don't let fear flood your minds and hearts, as you, slowly, immerge into a new normal world, but trust in God and keep your focus on Jesus, who loves each of us unconditionally. It is with this reassurance, we can face an uncertain future, with confidence and grace.

As frustrating as Computers, phones and IT in general can be to use, I think we can all agree that Lockdown has brought out the best in IT for us. I can say from a work basis, I have been very fortunate that my company issued me with a laptop and phone to allow me to work from home since March

From the start of lockdown back in March I felt I wanted to ensure that although we couldn't meet in person we still had a place to worship online. Thank Goodness for the medium of Facebook, where I was able to create a page for us to view readings, prayers and even music. The page took off better than I could have imagined. continue to help us going forward.




May our members be filled with new love and power.
