

Churchgoers across the Church of England are set personally to invite up to half a million people to services on Back to Church Sunday, 27 September 2009, making the event one of the largest co-ordinated evangelism events shared across the Church in recent history.

Every one of the Church's 44 dioceses are taking part in the initiative this year, by encouraging churchgoers to invite someone they know who used to attend church to come back on a particular Sunday. Churches will focus on extending an even warmer welcome than usual on the day, The following is a quote from last year's event: "Several people turned up without knowing quite why, and were very glad they did. Many of the visitors had a fresh view of what church could be and, we hope, a clearer idea of why we believe in God."



For us at Christ Church and also at Holy Trinity this will also be our Harvest Sunday. (This year we will be supporting **Tearfund** see inside for details). So why not do someone an incredible favour and invite them to come to church! It's not as hard as you may think. 1000s all over the country came back to church through someone being brave enough to offer an invitation..

Last year, the Diocese of Lichfield was the largest participant in Back to Church Sunday and research suggests that 6,000 people came back to church in the Diocese, six months later between 700 and 900 (12-15 per cent) had become regular members.

Alpha is an informal course which has helped millions of people throughout the world to find out what it means to be a follower of lesus today.

The course is over 12 weeks and will be based in the ABCC centre situated under Holy Trinity, Breck Rd. The first session is on Thursday 17th September at 7.30pm. You do not need to know the bible. At each session there is presentation and then there is a discussion.

You can join in this or simply listen to what other people are saying and asking.

The sessions cover subjects like, 'Who is Jesus?' and 'Does God heal today?' There is also a day away, where we look in depth into the work of the Holy Spirit. Details of the weekend will be made available later.

To help us get into the mood, each evening, there will tea or coffee and a 'mouth watering' pudding.

Shirley's Journey into the Unknown

My journey into the unknown began with a week long camp at Croxteth Park in 2005, at Merseyfest. During the week we had a really difficult and dirty task to move rubbish that people had dumped more or less on their own doorstep but throughout the week God spoke.



God spoke it would have been quite nice, if not scary, for this to be in the form of a burning bush or perhaps an angel, but it wasn't. Instead it was through dreams, visions, constant nagging sometimes rather random

thoughts and through other people that I heard God speak.

All this took some unravelling but the message that was coming through strong and clear is that God wanted more. How much more though I didn't know.

You can choose to ignore the voice of God in your life but He is patient and from what I've realised, persistent but at the same time not pushy. This was a really unsettled time in that what seemed important faded into the background and issues I'd not been too concerned about became overwhelming.

One such issue was that (whatever the church had to offer in the shape of events and activities) for some people the step of coming to church is too great. It was only through spending time with God in prayer and quietness, by talking to my family and other people and then by actually exploring my calling for ordained ministry did any sense begin to emerge. It was at this time when I also experienced peace – something that had been absent for a while. To anyone who may say, "God doesn't speak to me", I would

encourage you to spend time with God, listen carefully and widely, be open to suggestions no matter how 'out the box' they may be and remember what God calls you to do He'll equip you for - I'm relying on that one!

In effect I've handed in my three year 'notice' at Christ Church and how that time will fly. The thought of leaving is at present unthinkable but the call of God has to be greater than the desire to stay in what's a comfortable place. The journey is unknown but thankfully the Travel Guide isn't and all He asks is that we love and trust Him.
