CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) OUTBREAK

Update 4th July 2020

Following the Prime Minister's announcement that places of worship may re-open for worship from 4th July, much information has now been received from the government and the church authorities.

We are not yet in a position to re-start services as we need to be sure that certain conditions are met and all the guidance is followed. We will keep you up to date with the situation at all four of our benefice churches and advise you as soon as any decision has been made to resume services.

VIRTUAL SERVICE OF EVENSONG THIS SUNDAY 5th JULY AT 6.00pm.

We are holding a virtual Evensong tomorrow at 6.00pm, with thanks to Jerry Breslin who is setting this up via Zoom. The choir have held a couple of these very successfully and so we are pleased that we are able to extend this to the wider members of the Benefice.

If you would like to participate then please get in touch with me and I will send you the link with the log in details and other information about the service.

It will be different from our usual Evensong services but it will be a long time until we can hold any services with any singing.

CHURCH OPEN:

A reminder that the church is currently open for just two sessions per week in order that the building can be closed for 72 hours between opening times to minimise risk of infection. The church is open on:

Sundays:- 10.00am – 2.00pm

Wednesdays:- 2.00pm – 5.00pm

We will increase the opening times as soon as we feel it is safe to do so following the guidelines provided to us. Any change to the opening times and other updates will be notified on our website:- www.brickhillschurches.org.uk

There is hand sanitizer available at the entrance and we ask that you read the guidance provided on the blue notice board as you enter the church. Much of the church has been cordoned off and all bibles, books etc have been removed. Please take your own bible or reading matter with you. There are chairs available near the altar should you wish to sit and say a prayer, or merely enjoy the wonderful space.

We would remind for those in vulnerable groups to check the current government guidelines. We will welcome all those to visit the church who feel comfortable to do so.
