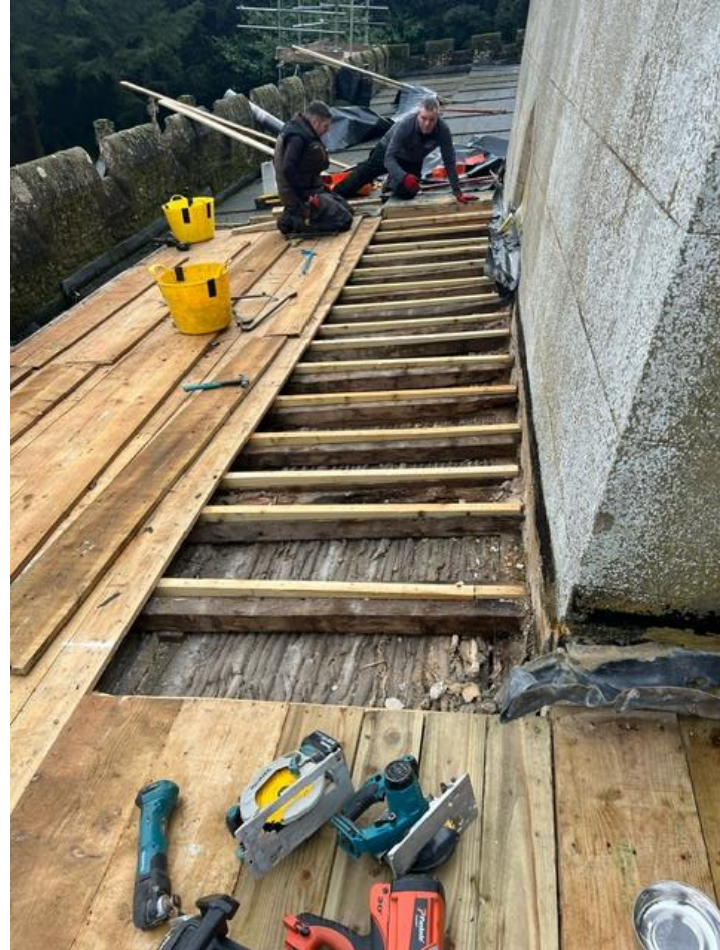
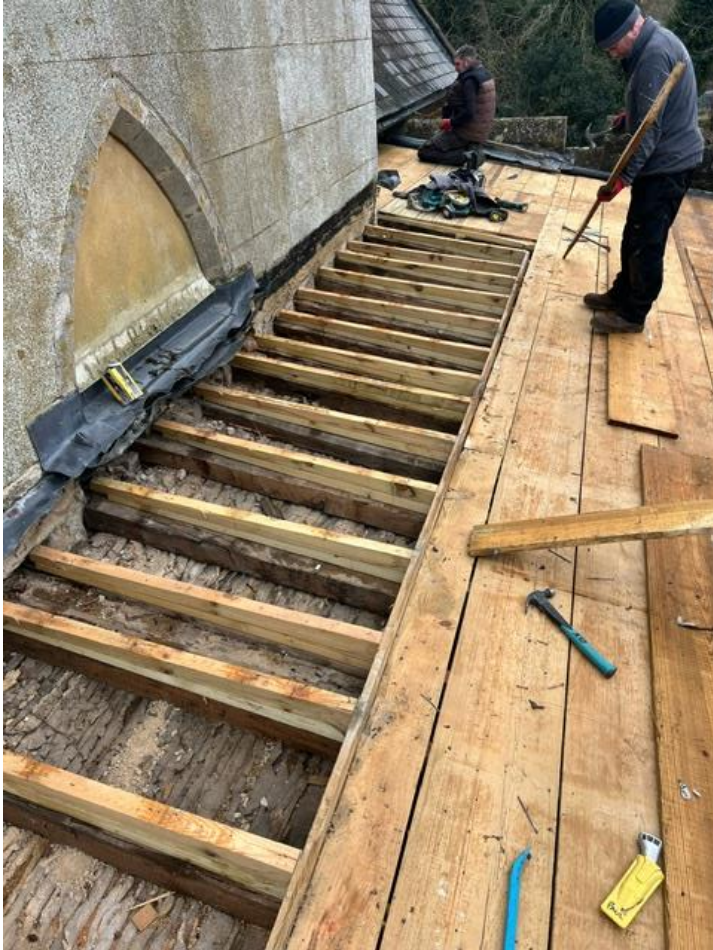
January to June 2024

It has been an exceptionally busy first half of the year at St Mary's with lots going on amid major roof works, and with the Rector on a three-month sabbatical

THE RE-ROOFING PROJECT

Following a total restoration of both the north and south aisle roofs in 2008, all the lead was stolen in 2018. The temporary covering of felt was failing and water came into the church every time it rained. The work to replace the felt with terne-coated steel commenced on 12th February

Internal work required – ceiling & walls



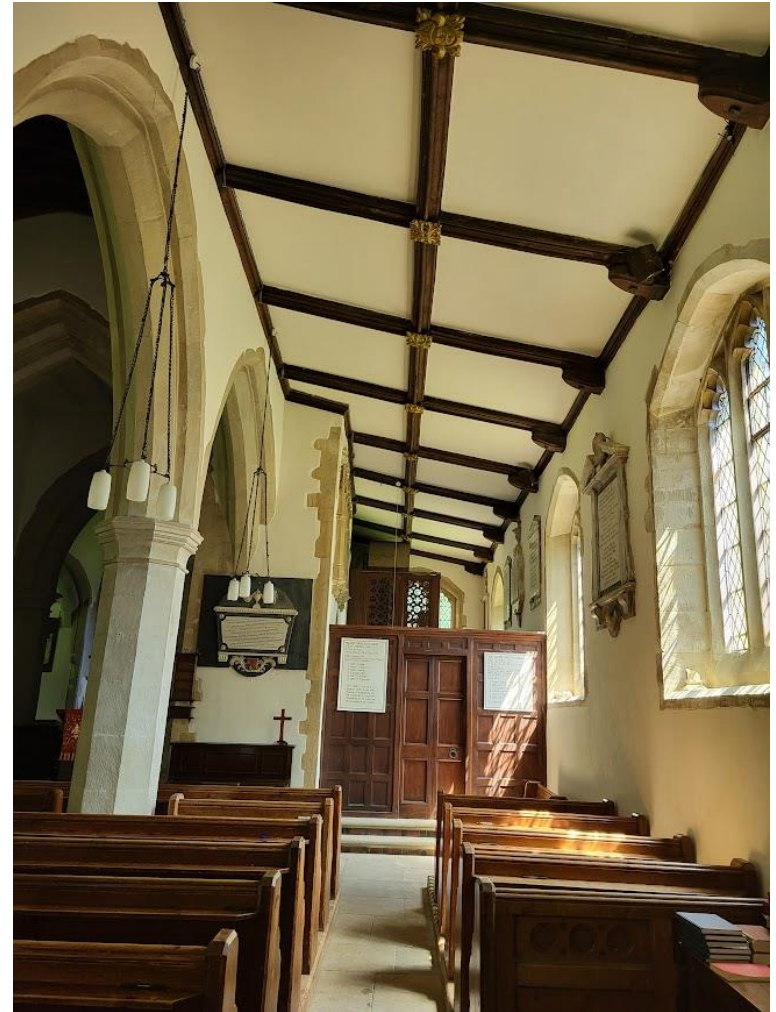
Additional rafter repairs required on two ceiling panels

GRANT AWARDED FROM:-

National Churches Trust “Last Chance Churches”, a special £500,000 match-funding appeal open until March 2024. St Mary’s was chosen as one of 18 churches across the country to be a recipient from this fund.

The award of £30,850 has enabled us to complete the roof work in one go, rather than having to do it in stages.

Unfortunately, the church had to be closed while the work was taking place but despite the dust and disruption, all services continued as normal, thanks to a lot of hard work cleaning and tidying
