Letter from John Orr – Interim Moderator

One of the challenges of 'being church', I think, is how that works out in our everyday lives. It's easy to 'be church' when we are surrounded by like-minded people on a Sunday, or at a church event. It's far more of a challenge when we are in a company of people who have no interest in the church, or may even be antagonistic towards faith. It's easy to be church when we are organising coffee mornings or running family fun days. It's more of a challenge when we are confronted with views that go against our understanding of what it is to welcome the stranger and provide for the vulnerable. In my own churches I tend to use the lectionary and for the last couple of weeks the readings from Ephesians have been particularly apt for the events in our land in recent times. Ephesians 4, into chapter 5, speaks of unity. We have had plenty of current examples of disunity or promoting division and hatred. Those same chapters encourage us to use words which are helpful and encouraging. It's easy to keep silent when faced with offensive opinions. Finding words of inclusion and welcome in the face of discrimination and persecution is the work of the church, as a collective body, Sunday by Sunday, and as individuals, every day. When we are 'being church', collectively and individually, then we are truly building God's kingdom and doing his work. Let's continue to set fine examples of inclusion and welcome, and be bold in speaking out for mercy and justice.

WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING

The group enjoyed reading 'The Nightingale' by Kristin Hannah, telling of two French sisters separated by years and experiences in World War 2. One joined the Resistance, helping hundreds escape

over the Pyrenees to Spain, the other taught children she hid in a convent. Both faced brutal treatment by the German occupiers. A good read in this year commemorating the D-day landings and soon in cinemas.

'The Survivors' by Jane Harper - a murder mystery revealing long-buried secrets still felt in the small coastal community on Tasmania. The victim's brother returns there and the story unfolds, with an unexpected twist. All enjoyed this read but questioned why the murder was not solved at the time. The title refers to a statue on a promontory close to caves where people drowned in the incoming tide.

'The Lost Bookshop' by Evie Woods - a fairytale about three people linked by their love of books. One a researcher, one escaping from an abusive husband in Ireland, and another searching for a lost Emily Bronte manuscript. There are love stories here, but the characters are all a bit odd, to say the least. A book we would not recommend!

'The Cruise' by Caroline James - three friends on the cusp of retirement go on a cruise together, one to find a man, another to find herself, and the third to get away after her husband's death. The book takes you to the Caribbean, revealing the three characters' relationships, also with other passengers and staff. Amusing, but not everyone's "cup of tea".

Our next book is 'The Bookseller of Inverness' by S G (Shona) Maclean. After the 1746 Jacobite rebellion, years later anger is still rife due to the defeat at Culloden. A wounded survivor becomes embroiled in the death of a person in his bookshop looking for a specific book about the battle. It was the hidden names in the book he was after!

Met at the airport by Susan and Johnny Forbes and Jim Stewart, they were joined in Forfar by hosts Elizabeth, Edith and Alison for a delicious welcome meal at Chapter and Verse. A great opportunity to get to know everyone or be reacquainted with those they'd met before.

On Friday, the Swiss were impressed to hear from Jim Stewart about all the fundraising and income generation our church does. Bob Kidd arranged a full tour of the East & Old church building, explaining its history and key features. Then a tour of Forfar led by Karen Liddle including the street art, up Castle Hill, the Botanists Garden in the Myre, followed by the Meffan Institute for more on Forfar's history and the Witches, with additional information from Shaun Wilson, local historian and researcher.

After a lovely lunch from the Wee Bakehouse, we visited Angus Archives, where Heather Munro talked about the church and Eco Garden at Restenneth, cared for by East & Old; then museum curator and tour guide Karen took us round Restenneth Priory, which the Swiss and Scots alike enjoyed.

Everyone met in the evening for fun, food and dancing at a traditional ceilidh. Members of the social committee laid on a Scottish meal of cottage pie followed by clootie dumpling or bread n' butter pudding, then a local accordionist provided the music, arranged by Linda Spence. It was a fun night, and we were pleased our former minister Barbara Ann and her husband Billy joined us.



On Saturday, 30 Swiss and Scots travelled to Edinburgh for the day. Thankfully, it was warm and mostly dry. Activities centred around 'Our Church' meaning the Church of Scotland and a trip up the Royal Mile pointing out Canongate Kirk, St Giles Cathedral, John Knox House and statue as well as many local landmarks, then free time to soak up the atmosphere. On Sunday, our Swiss friends joined us for morning worship at Inverarity and then again at East & Old, for services led by Susan Forbes and Karen Liddle, with the theme of inclusion, diversity and being one community. We waved goodbye after the service, as most of the Swiss headed off to Iona to a special retreat with the Iona Community, while David Liddle took the rest to Edinburgh Airport.

What a super weekend we had with our Swiss friends, sharing fellowship and learning about each other's faith communities. A real example of communities working together. We hope they enjoyed their visit to Scotland as much as we enjoyed having them. **T**amily Worker Report - Throughout the summer holidays we had a very successful range of activities within and out-with the church. We handed out packed lunches for around 350 people, meaning we helped a total of 126 families this summer.

Our annual Dedication Service takes place at the morning service at East & Old Church, on Sunday 17^{th} November, when we would be pleased to see parents and friends attend.


