Ryan Elliot was presented with his Queens badge and Liz McDougall the leader in charge of the GB was presented with her 30 years' service award – congratulations to them both. The BB then presented Irene and Bill Duthie with gifts from the Company for all the time, effort and dedication they put into working with the BB over so many years. Due to the Covid restrictions nothing could be done sooner and along with the BB the minister, the Kirk Session and the congregation also thank Irene for her work within the Boys' Brigade.



Accord entertainment group – have performed on a couple of occasions over the last month or so and it was so good to be back out performing and entertaining they told us. Fun, laughter and catching up with lots of people.



Tattie Festival: **Week 1 – Tattie Craft Event and Tattie Brunch**

A good number of people attended these events and the craft event was fun followed by homemade tattie soup and tattie and leek soup followed by bars of macaroon. Our minister was shocked, yes **SHOCKED**, that most of the helpers at the brunch had never tried potato scones before! And then there was a discussion about how to cook them! Being from the West of Scotland it had to be fried our minister said! However it was a great morning and everybody left feeling very full up.



Week 2 – Tattie Games Event, Tattie memory dreel and Tattie Tea

The games morning was a hoot and when we ran out of space moved into other areas of the church. Some of the games got peoples' hands dirty, they had to use their brain in others and lots of hand to eye co-ordination. The big hit that day was lunch from McDonalds! The memory event was also a big hit and our minister said she has never seen so many of our members talk so animatedly on any other subject. It took them right back to days they knew well with the stories they shared and also the hard work that it was. A big thanks to Bob Kidd for organising and hosting this event. The tattie tea was great! Four kinds of stovies, oatcakes, trifle and macaroons! The people ate so much they practically rolled out the door. A big thank you to our ladies who made the stovies and helped to serve.

Communion Sunday is always the fourth Sunday in October which was 24th October this year.

Both daytime services were well attended and even though we are still using the fellowship cups due to current restrictions, they were great services. The retiring offering that day was in aid of the Church Fabric Fund and **raised £376.15**. Thank you to everyone who contributed.



Remembrance Sunday 14th November - this service was well attended with the retiring offering going to **Poppy Scotland and Erskine Hospital raising £285.22**. Thank you to Jim Nicol, Ian Brymer and to Tyler Lovegrove from the Boys Brigade for laying the church wreaths. Another thank you goes to Mark from the Forfar Instrumental Band for playing the trumpet at the act of remembrance. Our minister asked for minimal decorating of the church this year and Irene Duthie and May Clark made a very impressive job of decorating the church for Remembrance – simple, elegant and very eye-catching—thank you ladies. The service at The Cross resumed this year although numbers were down slightly, but it was good to be part of the Forfar Community remembering those who gave their all.



Leprosy Mission Shoe Appeal – this appeal has been a huge success and very big thank you to everyone who donated, from members to visitors to the church and to people in the community. £1000 was the total raised just from East and Old Church.

Wooded Area at Padanaram – we raised £900 to plant trees in the new wooded area in Padanaram in conjunction with the Woodland Trust and Angus Council. There was enough money for that area and some money left over so we have been given permission to plant two new trees in the church graveyard and these trees are established trees so they cost £150 each from Angus Council. We have also given a tree to Strathmore Primary for them to plant a tree in their grounds and sent money over to Hungary for them to plant a tree in their grounds also. Once again thank you to all who donated money for this wonderful venture which is also helping our environment.



COP26 – In a number of sermons and on-line reflections our minister reiterated the hopes of COP26 and how we can help the people and the lands that are so affected by the changes in the environment. In addition to this a banner was put up on the church rails next to Prima and everyone in church was given a useful hints booklet on how they can help the environment in a small way. The leaflets were also given out in the shop and at the gate to passers-by. We handed out wildflower seeds at the gate our church to encourage people to plant these seeds in their gardens or window-boxes.



Care Home Services – Our minister was delighted to be invited back into Benholm, Finavon and Lochbank Care Homes to conduct worship service once again. Barbara Ann and Elizabeth McLeod visited in November to all three and are to be going back in December. The residents were happy to see them and enjoyed singing the hymns. We are hoping the other three care homes will soon allow church services once again.




Please pass this information on to any S1-S6 youths.

Hello everyone - Greetings from Zuglo church!

We hope you are doing well.

As you may have heard from Barbara Ann, one of our ministers Noémi passed away on November 23rd. She was only 45 and this is a great shock to all members of the congregation. She was the wife of our pastor János who is now left alone with their two teenage children. There is no information about the funeral yet, but the congregation will surely hold a memorial service soon.

The second half of 2021 has been overshadowed by health issues of both of our pastors. Noémi was in hospital from the end of September in critical condition. Her case had nothing to do with covid, her death was caused by an internal medical issue.

Our congregation and other congregations/denominations in Zugló kept praying for her recovery during her hospital stay, but God had something different in mind. The congregation, like a big family, must also go through a period of mourning, after which we'll be able to think of all the nice memories and happy moments we shared with Noémi. But now this looks distant and the process may take several weeks or even months over the Advent period.

Zugló church has officially one elected pastor position (János) and an assistant pastor, so the current situation does not necessarily imply further management change. János can stay with us in the long run and eventually work together with a new minister.

As Noémi was in hospital, the whole work of the congregation got reorganised exempting János from his duties until the end of this year. Many tasks have been taken over by our junior pastor Áron who has earned his degree and got his ordination lately. (He and his wife Erika were with us on the choir trip in 2018.) Áron and Erika are expecting their first babies (twins) in a few weeks' time, so this will be a very difficult period for them. But also happy news.



Another female minister Gyöngyi (pronounced junji) who serves primarily as a religion teacher in schools of Zuglo also helps with worships now. Church members serve as volunteers for administrative duties. Besides the two ministers mentioned, we also get external substitution one Sunday a month.

Worships of our church this year have been going on with personal presence since May, with two services each Sunday. Most worships are audio broadcast live on the internet. Since November, church members have again been asked to wear a mask at church just like they do on public transport and in shops and people are disciplined to do that.

János celebrated his 50th birthday at the end of September and was congratulated at church on September 26th, with greetings from elders, the choir and many church members. Noémi's mother (also a minister) preached at this special service. (She served in the ethnic Hungarian communities of Slovakia, but is now retired.) This was the last time the congregation actually saw Noémi.

To finish with our permanent topic, the pandemic, sees Hungary in the middle of the fourth wave. New cases exceed 10,000 every day and there are over 150 deaths daily. 6 million of the 9.5 million population have been vaccinated twice and about 2 million have had their third jab also. There is an abundance of various vaccines available, but some can't be persuaded to have the vaccination.

The government has enabled employers to make vaccination mandatory for employees or else be put on unpaid leave. However, with a shortage of manpower in many areas and services, employers do not want to risk losing more people due to a decision they don't absolutely have to make.

Thank you for your sympathy and prayers and we hope to be able to give you better news next time.
