Hello my dear friends

Wishing you all every blessing in the coming year!



*The aims of the project called **Stitches 4 Survival** was to knit panels 39inches by 24inches depicting the colours of the environment including blues, greens, yellows etc. telling their 'story' knitted into the panels was a phenomenal variety of Ideas - overall we produced 6 panels . Pictured below is an example of one of the designs - our other 5 were equally spectacular which we have photos of in the church. The idea of the panels were to ensure that the smallest deprived child in the poorest countries are kept warm. Before their final destination, all the panels were shown by being hung on washing lines - fences etc. throughout the*

*south of Scotland before being sent to the company known as Stitches for Survival. It is gratifying to know we were part of a spectacular amount of work spreading joy and kindness throughout the world. You should have seen the famous washing greens in Glasgow Green ablaze with the colour of all the panels, before being sent to the final stitchers in the south of Scotland. The town of Portobello was where ours were finished off for transport abroad. The stitcher ladies there were so complementary of our church ladies work - **well done to all involved.** We made a difference to a small part of the world!*
