# LETTER FROM THE MANSE

*My dear friends!*

*Many of you know that I write material for an all-age worship publication along with a few of my colleagues in the ministry (all the money that comes in from that goes to educational charities). So at the moment I am writing material for February/March 2022. In my to-do-list which sits on my desk I am already working on Remembrance Sunday and planning Christmas material also! And I wonder where the year has gone!*

*Once again we have exciting news in East and Old. The Kirk Session took the decision that we needed to employ someone to do the many day-to-day jobs that revolve around church life so to that end we spoke and then interviewed Paula Stewart our church treasurer to ascertain if she would be interested in expanding the role that she does at present. We are delighted to say she did and has agreed to work for us for 24 hours a week as our treasurer and administrator. Paula will be based in the new church office (former choir room) Monday to Friday 9am to 1pm and working at home for a short period also. If anyone has any church queries, would like to visit/view the church, book a room/hall or have any queries they are now to contact Paula on 07897 456655 or email her on [eastandold@yahoo.com](mailto:eastandold@yahoo.com). As Paula is now working from 9:00am to 1:00pm Monday to Friday we have informed Paula that she is only to answer work calls/emails and texts during these hours so please do not expect an immediate response*

*from her outwith these hours.*

*The other piece of exciting news is that we are working in conjunction with the Woodland Trust and Angus Council to help the environment by planting a wooded area. Wooded areas need to be planned and permission sought (you can't plant any type of tree anywhere you want as it might not be beneficial to that area and the impact would be lost). The area chosen by the council is at Padanaram and we are to raise the funds to cover a quarter of the site. The trees are between £15 and £30 and if enough money is raised we also hope to plant willow trees which are more expensive. Angus Council have agreed we can donate the wooded area in memory of the Coronavirus Outbreak and to the many people affected by this disease through death, illness, long Covid, bereavement and to all the essential workers during that time. Another added bonus is that we will be able to help in the planting of the trees. All donations can be handed into the church – it is open Monday to Friday 9am to 1pm – did you know that? Or at church on a Sunday or The Big Kirk Shop.*

*God's work is never done, God's mission never finishes and we can't stand still or we become out of date and stale. Great work is happening in East and Old and the community of Forfar and we are all part of that.*




## WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING ....

We had over 150 people through the building and lots and lots of memories shared. Due to the open day and the great coverage by Lynne Rankin on STV and our media team we have had numerous new bookings for the church premises which as well as helping the community gives us a source of income.

**Church Coffee Morning** – with the relaxation of rules we held our first coffee morning since February 2020 and it was so good to see so many familiar faces once again from church members and the community.

All protocols were followed and it gave everyone a good chance to catch up with people they had not



seen for a while. A grand total of £540 was raised and a big thank you goes to the social committee, all the volunteers and helpers and those who supplied baking and raffle gifts.





Although we are still two individual companies by name, we certainly are not individual companies on a Thursday night.


