The Peace

In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

Again and again you drew us into your covenant of grace. You gave your people the Law and taught us by your prophets to look for your reign of justice and peace.

As we watch for the signs of your kingdom on earth We echo the songs of your angels in heaven, evermore praising you and singing:

Holy, holy, holy Lord God of power and might Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Lord God, you are the most holy one, enthroned in splendour and light, Yet in the coming of your Son Jesus Christ you reveal the power of your love made perfect in human weakness.

Amen. Lord we believe!

Embracing our humanity,
Jesus showed us the way of salvation;
loving us to the end he gave himself to death for us;
dying for his own, he set us free from the bonds of sin,
that we might rise and reign with him in glory.

Amen. Lord we believe!

On the night you gave up your Son for us all he took bread and gave you thanks; He broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; Do this in remembrance of me.

Amen. Lord we believe!

In the same way after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; He gave it to them, saying:

Drink this, all of you, this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it in remembrance of me.

Amen. Lord we believe!

Therefore we proclaim the death that he suffered on the cross,

we celebrate his resurrection, his bursting from the tomb, we rejoice that he reigns at your right hand on high and we long for his coming in glory.

Amen. Come Lord Jesus!

As we recall the one perfect sacrifice of our redemption, Father, by your Holy Spirit let these gifts of your creation be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ and make us a perfect offering in your sight.

Amen. Come Holy Spirit!

Look with favour on your people and in your mercy hear the cry of our hearts. Bless the earth, heal the sick, let the oppressed go free and fill your church with power from on high.

Amen. Come Holy Spirit!

Gather your people from the ends of the earth to feast with all your saints at the table in your kingdom where the new creation is brought to perfection in Jesus Christ our Lord: by whom and with whom and in whom in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honour and glory be yours almighty Father for ever and ever.
