

Gospel Reading

Readings for Sunday 22nd June 2025

Collect:

God of truth, help us to keep your law of love and to walk in ways of wisdom, that we may find true life in Jesus Christ your Son. **Amen.**

Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 65. 1 - 9

The word of the Lord through the prophet: ¹I was ready to be sought out by those who did not ask, to be found by those who did not seek me. I said, 'Here I am, here I am', to a nation that did not call on my name. ²I held out my hands all day long to a rebellious people, who walk in a way that is not good, following their own devices; ³a people who provoke me to my face continually, sacrificing in gardens and offering incense on bricks; ⁴who sit inside tombs, and spend the night in secret places; who eat swine's flesh, with broth of abominable things in their vessels; ⁵who say, 'Keep to yourself, do not come near me, for I am too holy for you.' These are a smoke in my nostrils, a fire that burns all day long. ⁶See, it is written before me: I will not keep silent, but I will repay; I will indeed repay into their laps ⁷their iniquities and their ancestors' iniquities together, says the LORD; because they offered incense on the mountains and reviled me on the hills, I will measure into their laps full payment for their actions. ⁸Thus says the LORD: As the wine is found in the cluster, and they say, 'Do not destroy it, for there is a blessing in it', so I will do for my servants' sake, and not destroy them all. ⁹I will bring forth descendants from Jacob, and from Judah inheritors of my mountains; my chosen shall inherit it, and my servants shall settle there.

New Testament Reading: Galatians 3. 23 - 29 ²³Before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith would be revealed. ²⁴Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be justified by faith. ²⁵But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian, ²⁶for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. ²⁷As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ; ²⁸There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. ²⁹And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise. ²⁶Jesus and his disciples arrived at the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. ²⁷As he stepped out on land, a man of the city who had demons met him. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he did not live in a house but in the tombs. ²⁸When he saw Jesus, he fell down before him and shouted at the top of his voice, 'What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me' – ²⁹ for Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many times it had seized him; he was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the wilds.) ³⁰Jesus then asked him, 'What is your name?' He said, 'Legion'; for many demons had entered him. ³¹They begged him not to order them to go back into the abyss. ³²Now there on the hillside a large herd of swine was feeding; and the demons begged Jesus to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. ³³Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned. ³⁴When the swineherds saw what had happened, they ran off and told it in the city and in the country. ³⁵Then people came out to see what had happened, and when they came to Jesus, they found the man from whom the demons had gone sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. ³⁶Those who had seen it told them how the one who had been possessed by demons had been healed. ³⁷Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them; for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. ³⁸The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but Jesus sent him away, saying, ³⁹'Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you.' So he went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him.

Luke 8. 26 - 39

The Stories of Jesus The Wise and Foolish Builders

Orlando Gibbons (bapt. 25 December 1583 – 5 June 1625)

This month we mark the 400th anniversary of the death of Orlando Gibbons who was the leading English composer and organist of his day. Born in Oxford [and not Cambridge as it says on his monument in Canterbury Cathedral]. He was a member of the Chapel Royal, gained a degree in music from King's College Cambridge and in 1623 was appointed organist at Westminster Abbey where he played for the funeral of King James 1.



He seems to have got on with everyone and led a relatively quiet life compared to his contemporary organists John Bull and William Byrd.

His surviving works include church anthems such as "This is the record of John" and "O clap your hands" and a number of madrigals including "The Silver Swan." There are also a number of hymn tunes including two that we'll sing this Sunday. There will also be some organ music by more recent composers based on his music.

As an aside, it's said that actor Orlando Bloom was named after him.

In an act of shameless self-promotion, I'll be playing an organ recital on the instrument at the Church of the Ascension in Lower Broughton, Salford M7 IAG on 28th June at 1:00pm.

It's free entry with retiring collection and there will be refreshments. The church was gutted in an arson attack and a magnificent second hand organ installed in the rebuilt church.

Diocesan Synod

On Saturday, 7th June, Diocesan Synod met at St John's House to discuss the diocese's strategy, vocations, safeguarding, and to adopt the annual report and accounts for 2024. The opening worship was led by the Revd Canon Janie Cronin from Nelson Street, one of our new resource churches in Rochdale.

Opening Address

In his opening address, Bishop David reflected on all that continues to be achieved across our diocese because of the huge passion and commitment to the gospel demonstrated by the lay people and clergy in our parishes, chaplaincies and schools. He talked about the opportunities for our diocese as we develop our strategy and prepare to make an ambitious bid to the National Church Institutions for a major investment in our diocese over the next few years. Bishop David also welcomed the increase in clergy pensions which has recently been announced and the anticipated increase in clergy stipends, which it is hoped will have a positive impact on clergy wellbeing, as will the increased investment in our parsonages. <u>Read</u> Bishop David's address here.

The Diocese's Emerging Strategy

Helen Platts, COO/Diocesan Secretary, gave an update on the <u>diocese's strategy</u> – based on the four themes of Growing Younger, Church Planting & Revitalisation, Developing Missional Leaders and Parish Renewal – and the emerging plans in each of these areas that will form the basis of a bid to the national church later in the year. This is an opportunity for us to be bold and creative as a diocese and make the fundamental changes necessary to ensure we achieve our vision of being a worshipping, growing, transforming Christian presence at the heart of every community. Synod members engaged in lively discussions about each of the four priorities in break-out groups led by members of the Bishop's Leadership Team. This feedback will be important in helping shape our future plans as these are developed over the summer.

Annual Report and Financial Statements 2024

Synod were provided with an update on the financial results for 2024, which showed an underlying operating deficit of £1.3m. Work has been underway with parishes to increase the amount of <u>Parish Share</u> paid, and this is bearing fruit, although the diocese still has some way to go before returning to the break-even position. The annual report and financial statements were adopted by Synod.

Vocations

Our Director of Vocations, the Revd Canon Rachel Watts, shared her vision for vocations. She spoke about the importance of everyone, lay and clergy alike, being open to the skills and talents of those around them and encouraging them in their ministries and vocations, whatever form that might take, to enable us to build on our strong track record in this area.

Safeguarding

Abbey Clephane-Wilson, Diocesan Safeguarding Officer, updated Synod on the key safeguarding responsibilities of parishes, which was well-received. She is planning to visit all deanery synods over the coming months to provide a similar update.

Church Commissioners Increase Funding for Parishes and Clergy Wellbeing

The Church of England has announced plans to invest over £1.6 billion over the next three years to share the good news of Jesus Christ and serve local communities - a 36% increase on the national funding allocated in 2022.

This funding, distributed by the Church Commissioners who manage the Church's national endowment, will support a wide range of initiatives. These include enhanced clergy wellbeing, support for parishes, and continued investment in safeguarding and redress.

While this national funding is significant, the majority of the Church's work is made possible through the faithful and sacrificial giving of local congregations. This vital partnership remains the foundation of the Church's mission and ministry, for which we are so thankful.
