From the Minister's study—

Dear Friends,

As I write in the lead-up to the **100th anniversary celebration at Weoley Hill URC**, on the 3rd of July, I am particularly mindful that I am only 4 years, of the 100 years, part of the history of the church. Well, perhaps I can say 5 years as I was interim-minister for a year in 2009-2010. But what a “newcomer” I feel among the many long-standing members of the church, who can tell stories of what happened in and through Weoley Hill church over many decades. And a photo exhibition, prepared by Sue and Ann, will also tell the church’s story for us to celebrate and be thankful for.

People whose faith and faithfulness have helped build up the church will be remembered; stories of memorable events may well be shared as we sit down for an anniversary lunch after our worship. And it is good that we remember and celebrate! But, also, it is good to look at the present and even dare to hope for the future. We would not celebrate the past if we did not have a vision for the present and the future. There is a saying in the book of Revelation, chapter 21, verse 5, that springs to mind. “Behold I make all things new.” Any vision that we have for the present and the future must take these words seriously. For new things always happen.

Changes and renewal are part and parcel of being church. We only have to look back in our history to see how much has changed over the years. Yes, there was a time that the church was full, with hardly enough room on the pews. There was the time when students and staff from the Selly Oak Colleges would bring the “world church” into our church, “to our great benefit,” and who went back home carrying cherished memories of their time in our midst. There was the time when the Sunday School (Junior Church) was thriving and many remember the good time they had in their youth in the church even if they have moved on and moved out of the church.....

Changes have happened and continue to happen. And, certainly, we do not experience or consider many of the changes as positive. On the contrary, we lament our dwindling membership, our increasing lack of energy, the activities we have had to discontinue because of lack of interest and participation...and lately because Covid has made us more cautious as to when, where and how we gather.

It is the usual story, repeated in many churches! But (big BUT) some changes have been positive, and we should celebrate those. We may have become a small congregation, but it means we know each other better. Perhaps we have become even more friendly and inclusive than we were before because we are fewer in numbers, and we look out for each other! And we have felt even more excited whenever we have welcomed new members in the last few years who have gifted us with their presence and involvement in our church life.

Also, social events are being organized again, after the Covid pandemic, and we are grateful that we still have an active group of elders (serving and non-serving) and members who faithfully and with amazing dedication share in the various tasks of ministry, in our church life and outreach, and in our very nice but quite 'high maintenance' church building. We continue to be a generous congregation, supporting the church ministry as well as raising awareness about and collecting for the various charities and causes that we take to heart.

We are also known as THE church of Weoley Hill, ie the church that the community around us feels is "their" church even if they only join community activities in our church halls. And, last but not least, we are very happy to share our church building with a Korean and an Arabic congregation as well as welcoming many community groups in our halls and the church.

So, there have been changes over many years, and some things have not changed, but the words “Behold I make all things new” challenge us to envision what this may mean for our future. Does everything have to change? No, of course not. But changes there will be. It is inevitable. Some of the changes will be thrust upon us. Some will come as a pleasant surprise. And some may be contrary to all our plans, our hopes, our dreams..... But let us trust that God is working through us, and others we may not know yet, to bring the changes and the renewal to which God is calling us into the future.

“Behold I am making all things new” is a promise to us at Weoley Hill church, as it is to Weoley Castle Community Church and Bournville URC, if we are open to hear and receive this promise—wherever it may lead us!

May God continue to bless our ministry at Weoley Hill, in the Cadbury Pastorate, and help us to discern and be open to the “new things” that God certainly has in store for us in the year and years to come!
