VOLUNTEERS -

We are very aware that in these unprecedented times many people in our congregation and in our neighbourhood are going to become very isolated, some not having the luxury of nearby family or friends.

We are looking at ways of being able to offer one another prayer support as well as social contact.

We would also like to co-ordinate those who are willing to help in practical ways – shopping, collecting prescriptions, and more – putting volunteers in touch with those in need.

We hope to keep the Church open during the week as usual, although a number of our volunteers will be self-isolating.
