Nations can have patron saints too.

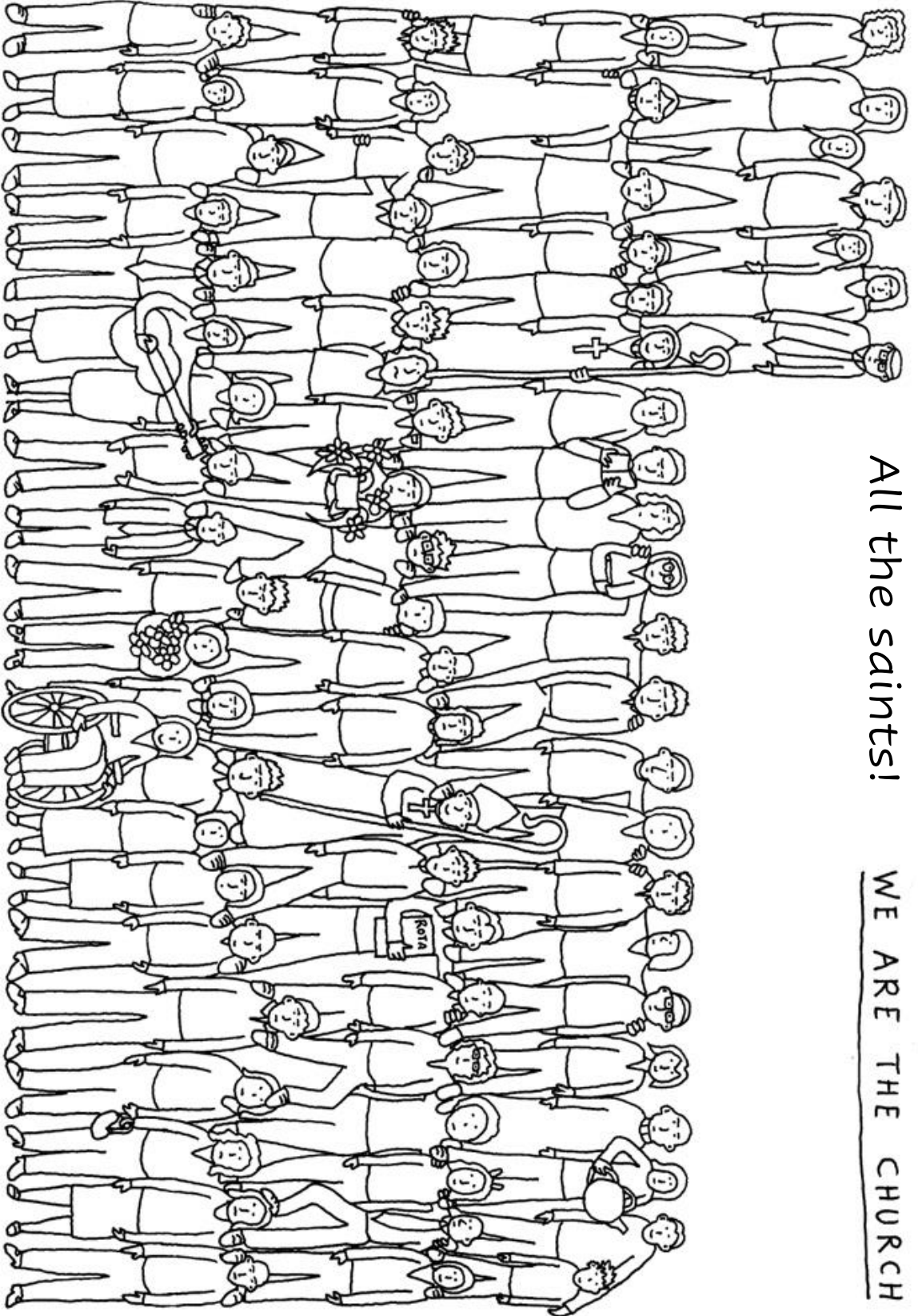
