UKRAINIAN REFUGEE ACTION GROUP (URAG) Thank you to everyone who came along to the meeting last Sunday to look at ways we can unite as a church to support Ukrainian refugees and their hosts. As a result we have a co-ordinating group of 9-10 people and we hope to be able to offer a range of services. We would also like to make these services available to refugees and hosts outside the church and share resources with other churches and organisations. If you are thinking of hosting refugees but have not yet registered you can do so via the government website <https://homesforukraine.campaign.gov.uk>. Once you have done that you need to find refugees requiring hosts. This can be done through www.homesforukraine.org although they are still working on their website. The Sanctuary Foundation (www.sanctuaryfoundation.org.uk) is run by Krish Kandiah, a Christian and they can support you further with information. We will be meeting shortly to discuss ways forward and then invite church members to volunteer to assist with the various activities e.g. someone has already offered to run an art group. As this is something that is likely to expand outside the church, I have set up an email address which can be shared widely for those seeking information: stmatts.urag@gmail.com Tessa



Christian Aid Ukraine Appeal

Readings for Today

Isaiah 55: 1-9

'Come, all you who are thirsty,
 come to the waters;
 and you who have no money,
 come, buy and eat!
 Come, buy wine and milk
 without money and without cost.

² Why spend money on what is not bread,
and your labour on what does not satisfy?
Listen, listen to me, and eat what is good,
and you will delight in the richest of fare.

³ Give ear and come to me;
listen, that you may live.
I will make an everlasting covenant with you,
my faithful love promised to David.

⁴ See, I have made him a witness to the peoples,
a ruler and commander of the peoples.

⁵ Surely you will summon nations you know not,
and nations you do not know will come running to you,
because of the LORD your God,
the Holy One of Israel,
for he has endowed you with splendour.'

⁶ Seek the LORD while he may be found;
call on him while he is near.

⁷ Let the wicked forsake their ways
and the unrighteous their thoughts.
Let them turn to the LORD, and he will have mercy on them,
and to our God, for he will freely pardon.

⁸ 'For my thoughts are not your thoughts,
neither are your ways my ways,'
declares the LORD.

⁹ 'As the heavens are higher than the earth,

Luke 11: 1-13

One day Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.'² He said to them, 'When you pray, say:

“‘Father,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come.

³ Give us each day our daily bread.

⁴ Forgive us our sins,
for we also forgive everyone who sins against us.
And lead us not into temptation.”’

⁵ Then Jesus said to them, ‘Suppose you have a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say, “Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; ⁶ a friend of mine on a journey has come to me, and I have no food to offer him.” ⁷ And suppose the one inside answers, “Don’t bother me. The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can’t get up and give you anything.” ⁸ I tell you, even though he will not get up and give you the bread because of friendship, yet because of your shameless audacity he will surely get up and give you as much as you need. ⁹ ‘So I say to you: ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. ¹⁰ For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.¹¹ ‘Which of you fathers, if your son asks for a fish, will give him a snake instead? ¹² Or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? ¹³ If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!’

<i>Prayer</i>	Suggestions for our Praise and Prayer
Sun.	Praise God for the freedom of worship – pray for those countries where it is dangerous to even name the Name of Jesus let alone to worship together.
Mon.	As Covid rates rise again, please pray for all those seriously infected, for all to be vaccinated, for those working in hospitals again facing great demands and consideration for others as travel restrictions are now dropped.
Tue.	With news of peace talks regarding Ukraine, pray for justice, fairness and peace and that there will be an end to hostilities. Sanctions are causing shortage of supplies of Russian wheat which is vital to feed many Third World countries, already suffering from drought and malnutrition. Please pray for these innocent victims and for food to be made available.
Wed.	Pray for Her Majesty the Queen, that she will become really well again and able to undertake the tasks she would like to do. Praise God for her seventy years of reign.
Thu.	Pray for all the activities put on by the church especially where people not in the church take part. Pray, too, for all who hire our rooms that they may “feel” God’s presence and peace.
Fri.	Pray for teachers in our schools as they influence our young people. Pray about the possible appointment of a young person’s worker.
Sat.	Pray for all in our fellowship who suffer physically, mentally and spiritually. Pray that they may find their needs met as they trust in our Lord.
Sun.	Pray that the Lent Course may help us to be more compassionate Christians. Pray too for our Staff Team as well as our Wardens, Pere our Administrator and all lay people who help to lead services.
