The Church in the Woottons balance sheet is under considerable pressure and we are finding it impossible to make ends meet. This is partly because of the need to complete the two building projects I've mentioned, but it is largely because of the pandemic. Over the last 18 months or so we have endured three lengthy periods during which are churches were closed completely. We could only conduct two weddings and one baptism in the whole of 2020, and all of our fundraising events July's Art and Soul were cancelled. exhibition was the first event we have run for a very long time.

All this means that we have been unable to meet all of our financial obligations for the last two years and this year we are expecting to end the financial year with a deficit of £12-15000.

With the hope of making good this expected shortfall we are holding a Gift Day at St. Mary's Church on Saturday 11th September 9 – 4.00pm. Can you help us? Coffee and cakes will be on offer all day!

We have held very successful Gift Days in past years, and we have always been encouraged by the support we receive from the church and local community. We will be very grateful for any gifts you can offer – large and small – and you can fill in a gift aid slip if you would like to – this will make your gift even more valuable. Coming to Church – what you need to know.

Although the Government has relaxed the laws covering all COVID based restrictions we are aware that the Delta variant of Covid 19 is still a threat locally and within The Church in the Woottons we hold the safely and wellbeing of all who are a part of our community in very high regard. Taking this into account we are following these guidelines:

- We strongly encourage you to continue to wear face covering in church during when we gather for any kind of worship.
- If you do not wish to wear a face covering in church, we will ask you to sit on the balcony at St. Mary's Church, or in the kitchen area at All Saints Church.
- We have relaxed social distancing rules to a large degree and work on the 1 metre rule rather than the 2 metre rule in most parts of the church and we are using every pew now.
- For those of you who wish to maintain the 2 metre social distancing rule we will invite you to in one of the front pews where only alternate pews will be used.
- Hand sanitiser will still be available in church.
- We will allow and encourage singing in church, but you will need to sing

through face coverings for the time being.

- We hope to be able to offer coffee and tea after church soon. However, drinks will only be served outside, weather permitting.
- We still ask that you contact us to reserve seats.
- For the time being we will continue to offer only bread (wafers) at Holy Communion
- We will continue to share the peace using only words with no physical contact.
- We are currently restricting numbers who attend baptisms, weddings and funerals to 50 people for the time being

Everything is under constant review, and we expected to be relaxing these restrictions before long.

There are two other things I would like you to be aware of: Firstly, although we will be singing in church again we will not be reforming the church choir, or the music September until group at the earliest. David Hill, Linda Nash and Chris Symes will continue to be instrumentalists (and singer in Linda's case, from now on). Secondly, also in September, we intend to start the weekly 9.00am Breakfast at All Saints Church, I am sorry some aspects of church remain rather complicated and restrictive, but I thank you for your continued support and understanding.
