CANDLEMAS - Candlemas marks the end of the Christmas season and is also known as the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus Christ, the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or the Feast of the Holy Encounter. It commemorates the presentation of Jesus at the Temple as described in Luke 2:22–40. In years gone by, when churches were lit by candles, it was also the day that the candles to be burned in the coming year were blessed, hence the special service of Candlemas. In our churches we now continue lighting the Advent candles each Sunday until Candlemas. As the Christmas season actually continues right through to Candlemas on 2 February, it is customary to keep the Christmas crib up until Candlemas.
