

### <u>Vicar's Letter</u>

### Dear All,

As I write this, we are celebrating Pentecost also known as Whit Sunday. This is the day when celebrate the Holy Spirit appearing among the disciples and empowering them to go out to all the world and preach the Gospel. Some say it is the birthday of the Church. It is certainly a day, and an event worth celebrating and worth telling other people about.

This is just what we do as we walk around part of the parish in our Whit Walk. It's a highlight of the year for many of us: a wonderful brass band, hymn singing on the streets, a large number of people young and old, colourful flags and banners and generous amounts of food to finish. All the joy and exuberance of Holy Spirit on view to our friends and neighbours. We are, in effect, doing just what the Holy Spirit empowered the first disciples to do all those years ago; we come together as God's Church and we tell people about God's love and care. Is God calling you? Are you aware of God's Spirit prompting you to explore new paths? How can you live out your calling to be witnesses and disciples of Christ?



It was short notice but the application was approved and we hosted an afternoon tea in the church hall on Saturday 1st June. We had a really enjoyable afternoon with lots of our volunteers catching up and eating all the lovely food; there was so much left over that we could enjoy the food again after service the following day. "THANK YOU" to all our volunteers; we truly value all your support. We also thank Action Together for supporting this event.

Earlier this year, the PCC agreed that during baptism visits, Revd Denise should ask families if they would like to nominate a charity to share half of the proceeds of the baptism collection plate along with our Church. This has been very well received and, to date, donations have been sent to Dr Kershaw's Hospice, Cancer Research, Macmillan Cancer Support and the British Heart Foundation. Whilst helping other charities, we have also seen an increase in the amount donated to St Thomas Church. This came about because Simon was made aware of such a scheme in another Church and brought the suggestion to the PCC. **Angela's Journey** Well with my licensing service just days away now I've been asked to write some brief words about my journey to this point. If I'm honest though I never thought I was the type of person who God would choose to be a Leader in Church and a minister. God started working in my life from an early age and inspired me with some amazing women leaders who began my spiritual guidance. I'm talking of the Sunday school leaders I had at St. Matthew's with St. Mary's Church, Crumpsall. These included Miss Hannah, Mrs Roberts, Mrs Robinson and Mrs Sanderson, who were still teaching Sunday School 18 years later and asked me to join them. Their encouragement led me to take a more active part in the life of the church and make the decision to be confirmed.

When I started worshiping at St. Thomas's Moorside Church I was welcomed so warmly and encouraged to take part in various groups and church life. Then came the question 'Angela, have you ever considered becoming a Reader?' Since I was being asked by our then Church Warden, Corinne, I've experienced doubts, shock, joy, inspiration, friendship, and fellowship among many other emotions. Firstly, I needed to discuss my calling with Brenda, our Vicar at that time, and together we completed the application forms. Then came the interviews which included 3 with individuals from both lay and ordained ministers plus a half day panel at Church House which involved more interviews, a written activity and a role play activity with other Reader Candidates.

Once accepted the real journey began and it hasn't always been easy. There is a lot of work involved which can impact on other areas of your life. My away placement was challenging, as it meant I wasn't worshipping with friends and family but I began to see myself as a Leader under the guidance of Father David Warner, who gave me the opportunity to learn more about worshiping with all your senses and introduced me to more Catholic practices than I'd had previously experienced but which I now enjoy. However, the rewards far outweigh the difficulties encountered. I've made lifelong friends, both students and tutors at All Saints, who have travelled with me for the last two years. I've been inspired by my mentors and colleagues who have supported me through the highs and lows and the fellowship, sharing in worship and prayer has sustained me. The debates and discussions around scripture, faith, theology, and doctrine have been lively, challenging and enjoyable. I've learnt so much not just about the academics but about myself as well and I've changed, hopefully for the better, into a more understanding and tolerant person who will be able to support the community that has encouraged me to enter Lay ministry.

I'd like to finish this journey be thanking all those who have helped, inspired and supported me particularly my close family and friends but also Revd. Denise, Corinne, Revd. Paul, Father David but especially Barbara, Doris and Dorothy. Ladies you will always be role models x

Dear All,

I am writing to let you know that, after much discussion with the diocese over the best date, I now know when I shall be ordained to the priesthood. It will happen on **Saturday 28th September at 2.30pm**. Better still, it will not happen at the cathedral. I am delighted to say that I shall be ordained right here at St Thomas by the Rt Rev'd Mark Ashcroft, the Bishop of Bolton. As it will just be me being ordained I have asked that the service be conducted using the ordination liturgy found in the Book of Common Prayer. In its current form this service dates back to 1662 though it is based on the first English language ordination service from 1552. For many generations this was the service that was used to ordain Anglican priests and although the contemporary language service is most commonly used today (and fair enough - it makes for a lovely ceremony,) I do love the traditional form of service.

My first celebration of the Eucharist will happen the following Sunday morning, the **29th September** at the usual time of **10.30am**. As it is the feast of Michaelmas I shall be able to wear white vestments for the feast day which includes the stole given to me as an ordination gift by my former parish priest a year ago. Both services are public acts of worship to which everyone is warmly invited. I know that our regulars will come on Sundays anyway but I would encourage as many of you as are able, to come on the Saturday too. It should be a lovely occasion and a great joy for me to celebrate it at St Thomas' where I have been made to feel very much at home by you all.



- 1) Purchase milk from a milkman using glass bottles that are washed and reused.
- 2) If I buy prepared food for toddlers and babies, select the brands that use glass jars or tins that will be recycled.
- 3) I'm cooking fresher both for home and work using a steamer/blender.
- 4) I've found a grocer who delivers and avoids using plastic. The produce is fresher than the supermarket and delivered the same day. The downside is I can't book a time slot as easily as supermarket deliveries, but they will deliver to a designated safe location on my property. It's slightly more expensive than the supermarket, but the single items are larger and there is no delivery charge if I spend £7.50. As I live some distance away, I'm currently researching deliveries in the Moorside area and will hopefully have some information for you in the next magazine.
- 5) My Local butchers allows me to take in my own containers and I'm going to check the policy at the cheaper supermarkets option. I'm also looking into companies offering home delivery.
- 6) Instead of using plastic containers for hand soap, shower gel and other liquids etc. I've decided to go back to bars but I'm cutting it up small and placing it in little wash bags so each person, particularly the little ones, can have their own and I can change them daily to still meet the hygiene requirements of running my business.
- 7) I've swapped to recycled toilet roll and kitchen roll which is not only cheaper but comes in compostable wrappings.
- 8) I'm trying a toothpaste tablet now but not sure if it's for me. I'll take some on the STYLE spa weekend for the ladies to try and get their feedback.
- 9) I'm making plastics such as cellophane and other wrappings into Eco bricks. I'm not sure yet what I'll do with them, but I think it might be garden furniture or a climbing frame!
