- As you know, due to the continuing Covid-19 situation, all our services will be online this year via the Zoom platform.
- We will be using 2 Zoom codes during the festive season. You can find out which code is required for each of the services by referring to the middle pages of this Bulletin.
- Remember, that if you cannot join us using a computer you can use your phone to access the service as it happens. To do this, ring one of the numbers shown at the bottom of the page and follow the instructions:
- type in the Meeting ID followed by the # Key
- When asked for the host ID just press the # Key
- Type in the Passcode followed by the # Key
- The meeting ID and Passcode can be found in the middle pages of the Bulletin. If you are going to use the phone we can supply you with a paper copy of the words of the hymns and the reading, if you require this please let Colin or Judith know.
- After the service, we put the audio recording onto the Spondon Methodist Church website for those who couldn't get to the service. They can be found at spondonmethodist.org.uk/services/.
- Again, following the service we are able to provide a CD of it. These can be order via Jon Shepherd on 07717 288827.
- We hope that you will find some means of celebrating with us over the festive period, but if you are unable to join us, we hope that you will be able to find worship to suit you on the radio or television.
- However you worship this Christmas may you know the awe and joy of the baby born to be our Saviour.

The Christingle service is fast becoming a tradition associated with Christmas. The Christingle, meaning Little Christ Child, was first begun by a Moravian bishop in Germany in 1747. The Moravians in the UK were holding Christingle services from between the two world wars. Now many Christian churches hold these services in Advent, Christmas or Epiphany.

It is possible to join this service and soak in the atmosphere, but if you wish to create your own Christingle, you will need: An orange; A piece of red ribbon to fit round the orange; 4 cocktail sticks; some dried fruit or soft sweets (e.g. dolly mixture); A pin or Sellotape, and finally a small candle; something to light the candle with. (If you haven't got these items (Judith or Colin can deliver a small kit, excluding the orange to you).

In lighting the candle we remind ourselves that Jesus, who was born in the stable, is the Light of the World.

Like the Carol service, we invite you to sit by your tree and dress in a festive manner.
