The writer of Psalm 19 says, 'The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. From Mark Thompson- Write for Rights evening- 29th November-

Every year around the anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights- 10th Decemberwe take part in the campaign for those whose human rights are being attacked. People who've been harassed, threatened and unjustly jailed. For 20 years Amnesty International has been running this campaign.

This year we are planning a writing evening on Wednesday 29th November at Oasis. We will start at 7:30 pm and finish at 9:00pm, with a short break for drinks and cake. Everyone is welcome to join us – all the materials you need will be provided.

We write 2 kinds of letters-

- 1) to the authorities to ask them to change things, and
- 2) to greet the people we are supporting.

During the 2022 campaign more than 5.3 million letters were sent. We in Sandbach played our part in the huge impact they had in encouraging people who had suffered abuses, and in some cases in enabling people to fight and win their cases against injustice.
