NOTICE IS GIVEN that we are applying to the Consistory Court of the diocese for permission to carry out the following:

Rebuild, repair and restrain the collapsed churchyard wall, entailing:

Phase 1 - provide lateral support to the southern 30m section by installing self-drilled passive soil nail anchors.

Phase 2 - rebuild the collapsed northern 10m section of wall, consisting of an 85mm thick mesh reinforced cavity construction with reclaimed stone face outer leaf and 215mm thick concrete blockwork inner leaf, built off a 850mm wide reinforced strip foundation. Lateral support to the wall will be provided by passive soil nail anchors.

In accordance with Mason Clark Associates drawings nos. 18523-Y-DR-001 P1, 18523-Y-DR-400 T1, 18523-Y-DR-401 T1 and 18523-Y-DR-402 T2; Byland Engineering Ltd drawings nos. 2099/001 Rev 0 and 2099/002 Rev A and calculations document ref. 2099 Rev A; and On Site Archaeology Ltd Written Scheme of Investigation dated September 2020.

With provision also for some additional dismantling and rebuilding as set out in an email from Mason Clark Associates dated 21 August 2020.

A letter of objection must include your name and address and state whether you live in the parish and/or your name is entered on the church electoral roll of the parish or any other basis on which you have an interest in the matter.

Directions to petitioner

You must display this public notice (or a copy of it) for a continuous period of not less than 28 days, not counting the day on which it was put up or the day on which it is taken down, (or for such other period as the Court may direct and subject to any special directions of the registrar) in each of the following places:

1. on a notice board or in some other prominent position inside the church; and
2. on a notice board outside the church or in some other prominent position (whether on the outside of the church door or elsewhere) so that it can be read by the public.
