Old Testament Reading - Psalm 73:21-26

²² I was senseless and ignorant;
I was a brute beast before you.

²⁵ Whom have I in heaven but you?
And earth has nothing I desire besides you.

New Testament Reading - Luke 2:25-35

Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him. ²⁶ It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. ²⁷ Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, ²⁸ Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying:

²⁹ 'Sovereign Lord, as you have promised,
you may now dismiss your servant in peace.
³⁰ For my eyes have seen your salvation,
³¹ which you have prepared in the sight of all nations:
³² a light for revelation to the Gentiles,
and the glory of your people Israel.'
³³ The child's father and mother marvelled at what was said about him. ³⁴ Then Simeon
blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: 'This child is destined to cause the falling and
rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, ³⁵ so that the
thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too.'
