Dear Friends

Musing on the fact that this magazine covers the months of July and August, I was struck by how un-Christian our calendar is. All those centuries of predominantly Christian life in this country and the best we can do is to name our months after Roman leaders, Roman gods and Roman numbers. And what did the Romans ever do for us, anyway?

And it's no better when you look at the week – days named after the sun, the moon and a handful of Norse gods (except Saturday, which takes us back to the Romans again). What a bunch.

On the other hand. what would we name the months if we wanted to make them 'Christian'? There are, helpfully, twelve apostles but life would be complicated by the fact that there were two Simons and two

Jameses (and indeed two Judases if we were willing to include Judas Iscariot). We wouldn't know whether we were in summer or winter (as if we've had a clue so far this year, as I write this in chilly June).

Perhaps we could name the months after the fruits of the Spirit (but only nine of those are listed by St Paul). There are lots of lists of seven in the Bible, as that's the 'perfect' number, but to choose one of those would make for some very long months. Perhaps we're best leaving things as they are.

In any case, it doesn't matter. The crucial thing is that all time belongs to God. The Psalmist says, 'My times are in your hands,' and it is God who controls the course of the centuries, let alone the months. Paul tells us that God has an eternal purpose which is fulfilled in Jesus Christ. Whether our lives are long or short, and whether the summer is hot or cold, nothing happens which is outside of God's plan.

That's reassuring, in a world which often turns its back on God and suffers all sorts of troubles and uncertainties as a result. The outcomes of elections, coups, upheavals and misunderstandings are important in the short term – but in the end, God's wisdom will prevail and those who trust in him will be held in safety.

So let's enjoy the months of Julius Caesar and his great-nephew Augustus, knowing that the living God they never knew is Lord of time. Perhaps there will even be some sunshine, and not only on Sun-day each week.

The Benefice Book Group

This month we have been reading "The Diary of Elizabeth Pringle" by Kirsty Wark.

This most interesting and unusual novel alternates between telling the story of Elizabeth, which was in the past, and the story of Martha, which is happening as we read. Martha is acting for her Mother, Anna, who is Elizabeth's legatee but is suffering from dementia. This may sound confusing but that is not the case. The ease with which the reader can move back and forth between the two narratives is a tribute to Ms. Wark's skill as a writer.

The setting on the Isle of Arran is beautifully and evocatively described and even quite minor characters are clearly delineated, however briefly. Much of the narrative is sad and, even at times, tragic, but the last chapter, in a most surprising way, brings everything to a satisfying conclusion.

Much of the plot draws attention to the Mother/daughter relationship to which, all of us being daughters and some also mothers, could sympathetically relate. As with all novels it's a case of "Suck it and See" ,but I think that the group as a whole would advise you to read this one for yourself.

Mickley's Nature Notes

Before we left for Scotland in May, nesting was in full flow with blackbirds hatching their first brood as did dunnocks, robins and house sparrows arrived for the first time with us (nesting in the swift boxes!!!). Plants were slowly waking up from the wet and cold.

2 weeks later we returned to grass 50cm high, weeds everywhere, and fledglings everywhere.... three fledgling wrens sitting on a gate awaiting parents; three dunnocks ditto by bird feeders, robins sat in the nearby bushes ...poor parents darting everywhere searching for food. The blackbirds are utter comedians with males still sparring with each other, while the females just get on following us around the garden as we battle with couch grass and other weeds.

Mayflies have been very evident, with swallows and a few swifts flying up and down the line of the river as well as over the sheep fields. Sadly, butterflies are a little low in numbers except for the brimstones out since March, though we have seen the odd peacock, speckled wood, orange tip, tortoiseshell and small white. The defences have gone up for the brassicas vs the large white though, in readiness for their appearance.

Hares are everywhere coming into the village...wonderful to see them and their leverets. But no sign alive or dead of the hedgehogs...oh dear!
The village seems to have acquired a couple of wild turkeys, much to everyone's surprise.

Given Mickley seems to specialise in very dry springs, we are amazed at this wet spring and the growth of the trees, hedges, shrubs as well as the grass. Indeed our tree planting does look like a series of woods, with glades where we removed some of the trees over the years. So the hedges are full of birdsong from bull finches, yellow hammers, gold finches, both types of white throats and even spotted flycatchers. Wonderful!

Sawley Moor Lane Diary

Most the news comes from the top end of Moor Lane this month. The verges have frothed with cow parsley and next to the footpath by the little donkey house there is a generous and wonderful wildflower patch seeded by the farmer who repaired the stile. It looks absolutely buoyant and colourful.

Through the Skell Valley Project, volunteers have been controlling some of the bracken on the banks at Picking Gill and the little reserve is always well worth a visit. The trees are lush and green and have benefitted from the rainfall and the area has its own special atmosphere of calm and enclosure. A white sparrow has been seen near the top of the lane. It probably has a condition called leucism – a lack of pigmentation in its feathers rather than being a true albino with pink eyes but I'd love to hear about any further sightings of it.

We have finally put up the swift boxes on the village hall and should (and when) swifts return to the village a little home awaits them. Blue tits found their own home in the green metal box for disposing of cigarette ends on the village hall wall and have successfully fledged and flown.

The Pateley Shed Men have restored the mile post marker opposite The Yorkshire Yurts entrance on the B6265 and it looks splendid. Such heritage features should be cared for and congratulations to the Parish Council for seeing this work done and thank you to the men with the wire brushes, paint brushes and the appropriate and carefully selected paint.
