The Benefice Book Group

This month we have been reading "The Clematis Tree" by Ann Widdecombe.

The author's name alone suggested that this would not be an easy read, nor was it. We were confronted by the controversial subject of Euthanasia. Ms. Widdecombe handled her material with some tact but the very word "euthanasia" pre-supposes suffering, of which there is a great deal.

The characters, although not entirely likeable, are entirely credible and as they suffered, we suffered with them. There seems to be no possibility of a universally acceptable solution. As Rose Macaulay wrote at the end of "The Towers of Trebizond", "the pattern should perhaps be easier, the core less hard.. This seems indeed, the eternal dilemma".

There was much thoughtful discussion but we mostly came up with questions rather than answers. I can only suggest that you read "The Clematis Tree" and come to your own conclusion.



Our mosaic Sundial is easy to use and you can check the accuracy of your mobile phone time with it.

This is what you have to do

1. Find it in the corner of the village green near the climbing equipment.
2. When the sun is happy and shining, stand with your back to the sun on the appropriate month circle and see where your shadow points.
3. It is best to put your heels to fit where the days of the month might lie in between the month dials.
4. The inner arc of numbers, created by members of Sawley Arts Group, will indicate British Summer time.
5. The outer arc of numbers, created by children of Fountains School, will show Winter time time.
6. The 3 month dials show an apple tree through the year.
7. Have fun and never be late.


