I know that words of hymns have always changed, but this one particularly rankles for me. In the dark hours, the dark month of the year, I want to make sure that my lamp is burning brightly. I want to top up my oil of gladness. I don't want to feel guilty or anti-climactic. I want to be even more hopeful than ever.

The Jewish day has two parts, the first actually begins at sunset, or when three stars are visible. Twelve hours of the night are followed at sunrise by twelve hours of the day. My favourite Psalm is Ps 130. It speaks to me about how to live through the dark months or dark times in our lives.

 6my soul waits for the Lord more than those who watch for the morning, more than those who watch for the morning.

If God tells me something, He will do so at least twice. That way I am less likely to miss it. I imagine the Night Watchman on his battlement, in the cold and dark. He is not gloomy. He KNOWS beyond a shadow of doubt that soon the horizon will start to turn grey, that the sky will lighten, the sun's journey will begin again. He is full of hope, expectation and ready to ring the bells, blow his trumpet, or shout to the sleeping town that a new day is here. Let's not be weary, even if we are snuggled under the duvet, let's keep our lamps burning ready for all that 2020 will bring. Wait in Hope.




For many people, January is one of their least favourite months The joy and sparkle of Christmas is well and truly over, the credit card bills are starting to arrive, and winter feels as if it is going to

go on forever. So, what do we know about January? Here's some fun trivia for you:

- January is named after the Roman god, Janus, who was always shown as having two heads. He looked back to the last year and forward to the new one. This is why we think about casting out the old and bringing in the new - a month known by many as the start of a new year which brings new opportunities.
- The birth stone for January is the garnet, which represents constancy. The flower is the carnation.
- The first recorded reference to a 'January sale' in the UK was in 1865.
- Daytime temperatures in January make it the coldest month of the year in the UK. February nights are colder in England (but not Scotland).
- January was originally the 11th month, not the first, until at least 153BC.
- It used to have only 30 days but Julius Caesar added one more day to January in 46BC.
- According to the International Standards Organisation's ISO 8601, week 1 of any year is the week including 4 January.
- With the exception of leap years, January always begins on the same day as October. In leap years, January always begins on the same day as April and July.

Help for Local Residents from the LINK Porter Trust

The LINK Porter Trust has recently issued a hand-out leaflet to publicise the support it has available for local residents of RH8 who, through no fault of their own, have fallen on hard times. Although not making outright cash payments, the Trust does make grants to needy residents who cannot afford to buy items such as household equipment, school uniform or access to transport.

The Trust was founded in 1992 with a legacy left to LINK and, although part of LINK, is managed by a separate Board of Trustees. The income from the legacy, together with further donations received by the Trust has enabled around £140,000 to be paid in grants to individuals and organisations since 1992.

Applicants to The Link Porter Trust may call its Hon. Secretary on 01883 723370 to apply for help. They must be prepared to disclose their full financial situation so that a prudent assessment can be made by the Trustees. If applicants need to buy or pay for essential items (e.g. a cooker) and are in real need, the Trust will be delighted to help.
