

Message from your Minister:-



When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf..... John 15: 26 -27

As Pentecost is the time when the church celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit, we are tempted to read the verses from John's Gospel in chapter 15, far too quickly as if we know their subject already, after all, we have heard these words so often before.

We could easily sit there and say that the Holy Spirit is promised to the followers of Jesus; that the wind that blows through and enlivens the church was given on this day in history; and that this Spirit is promised to all members of the church through all time. And no doubt this is true, but perhaps this is all too much a quick, somewhat superficial reading of the passage from John and perhaps we are in danger of superimposing over the top, the overall New Testament story of the Spirit and thereby missing the individual contribution that this passage could make.

I remember when I was at theological college, one of my tutors saying that it was an oversimplification, to equate the Spirit of truth, the Paraclete, with the Holy Spirit. He said that he had been reading a theologian, Raymond Brown, who stated that the Paraclete is the Holy Spirit in a special personal role. The Paraclete is the presence of Jesus when Jesus is absent.

Jesus said further on in chapter 15 of John, that it would be to our advantage if he went away, "for if I do not go away, the Paraclete will not come to you" (John 16:7). Had we been there we might have argued strongly that no, we would much rather have him there, but Jesus is assuring us that he will indeed remain alive in the community, and in us, for the Paraclete will be Jesus' presence in the individual Christian. Jesus is promising to send the Spirit of truth to make a home within us or to become as Brown puts it, "a way of life or something that penetrates our very being."

Jesus is not with us now, but while he is with the Father, he has left us his presence in the person of the Paraclete. It is this Spirit of truth who guides us, to uncover and seek the grace and beauty of life. It is this Spirit of truth who teaches us to find God in the midst of life, to see life as Jesus might see it. It is this Spirit of truth, whom we experience in our heart as the presence of Jesus and through whom we might delight and worship our God. **Amen**

Changes in Personnel



Summer Worship At St Peter's Chapel

Many of you will have visited or at least heard of St Peters Chapel. It sits in an isolated location at the end of the Dengie peninsular, near the village of Bradwell on Sea. It is a very simple and yet inspiring place of worship. When you take part in a service at St Peters you are very conscious of a Christian tradition at the site that goes back to the foundation of the chapel by St Cedd in 654 CE.

St Peters holds services every Sunday evening in July and August at 6:30 pm. I would like to organise a Sunday evening visit (or perhaps more than one visit, as numbers are limited) which would include a bring-and-share picnic, a short walk for those interested, and a service at the chapel. I will shortly post a notice in the Jubilee Room asking whether folk are interested, so that I can contact the chaplain to make arrangements.

Meanwhile some FAQ's :-

Are there any loos? No, but I can hopefully arrange for toilets to be available at the Othona Community next to the chapel

What if it tips it down with rain? Again I hope to arrange with Othona for shelter to be available

<u>Is it a long walk?</u> The chapel is about half a mile from the nearest road, but there is a gated track that is opened up about half an hour before services, or other times by arrangement

Where can I find out more about St Peters? It has its own website www.bradwellchapel.org. If you're interested in the history of the chapel go to http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Chapel of St Peter-on-the-Wall which also has links to information about Bradwell, Dengie, St Cedd and Othona.

Why would I be interested in Dengie? It's an important wetland bird habitat and Special Protection Area (SPA). A magical and holy place on a summer evening.

DO YOU REMEMBER THE MINI-GLYNDEBOURNES WITH THE CHORISTERS AT BENFLEET?

Many people who used to come along have said that they do miss them, so on 14 June 2015 we are going to have another one, but this time with a cast of professional singers - no choristers as performers but hopefully they will be there as part of the audience. A small group from the Choristers – known as the "Friends of the Choristers" - is arranging this and if it works this could become a re-established part of the musical life in Benfleet.

So what are they going to do – **Madam Butterfly by Puccini – sung in English**. The cast includes our old friend Ben Thapa as the heartless Pinkerton and Jeni Bern as Butterfly, plus another five professional singers. The accompanist is Richard Pearce – a truly remarkable musician - and the accompanist for the Royal Choral Society.

The format will be the usual one – arrive from 5.30 pm and have a wander round the garden, then at 6.30 pm go into the marquee for Act one. We break at 7.30 pm for the 'long interval' with the main dining session, before returning at 8.30 pm for Act two.

The whole performance ends at about 9.30 pm but there is no hurry to depart and if it's a beautiful summer's evening you are welcome to linger before collecting your cars from the free car park on Reeds Hill Farm.

The evening is being heavily subsidised and the tickets will cost only £10, so book the date and get up a party to come – we can seat 350 people so there's plenty of room – and we have garden chairs available for your picnics and you are welcome to bring tables (and candelabras if you wish!). There will be a champagne raffle in aid of Fair Havens Hospice as we have done in the past.

METHODIST WOMEN IN BRITAIN

I have just spent a weekend at the Swanick Conference Centre in Derbyshire with 250 other women. The weekend was entitled 'being one, being whole, being God's'.

The main speaker was Rev Jackie Bellfield, a Methodist Minister from Warrington. During the main session we were asked to define who we are.....mother, wife, etc which was quite challenging. We are all labelled! In the next session Jackie told us about her church and 'The New Song Network' sessions they hold once a month. These sessions embrace the local community and they enjoy fellowship over a cuppa and cakes and sharing worship. The numbers have grown over the last 6 years from 60 to over 200 attending. One project they are involved in is being present at the Crematorium and Graveyard on Mothering Sunday, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day providing hot drinks and on one occasion gave out 600 hot drinks. What a Christian witness to the community.

We each attended two different sessions in the afternoon and the one I enjoyed most was 'creating quiet spaces'. With the help of many beautiful fabrics, flowers, baubles, etc we created a display depicting God's arms embracing the world and all that it resembles.

On Saturday evening Jackie organised a 'pub' quiz which was great fun. Our group came second to last out of 25 teams - but it was fun! The weekend finished with a communion service led by Jackie. She told us to get rid of the Goliaths in our life and rid ourselves of the labels - we hung labels on a cross and put our thumb prints on a cross to show that each of us is unique in God's eyes. When I received the bread from Jackie I felt that we were the only two people in the room and that her words were those of God.

From Jackie - when asked what you do simply respond by saying I love the Lord my God with all my heart, my soul, my mind and my strength'. What a challenger. Jackie is an inspiration to all and her love for God showed through all she said and did whether joking or sharing communion with us.
