crafts.



cause of this we can now have a relationship with God.




It's hard to get your head around it and it is for this reason we need to spend time with God in prayer and looking at the Bible. Lent is the time

Our most recent meeting on Saturday April 6th had many of our regular Dads and children attending, in spite of it being the day of the Grand National!


Much fun was had with the giant

We are going to keep the challenge open for a while longer - with a few rules - to see if their efforts can be beaten. Just let


us know if you want to have a go.

as they could and then invented some more.


Of course we had to have pancakes and the Guides also made gifts for their mothers - hand made chocolates and cookies.

Who let the Dads out? 4th May, 1st June and 6th July 10am-11:30am. A group for Dads and their children age 0-7. Come along for a morning of play.


Illumin8 4th May, 8th June and 6th July 6:30pm-8pm. Games evening for young people in year 5 or above who are members of Explorers or Footsteps.






week we had a wonderful time creating our own stories and performing them in our tent theatres!
