
#### Toddlers

toy cars. Some, with their Mums, prefer the 'book corner' and others enjoy doing jigsaws.


The craft table is always a highlight and this session we are doing the weather with pictures of kites, storm clouds and sunshine, which now all appear on the Toddlers display board.

## **Footsteps**

Do you ever get annoyed by your brother or sister? Fortunately, as an only child, I don't! Just imagine how bad it would be if you had 11 brothers or sisters to fall out with and



you managed to annoy all of them at once. Well this is what happened to Joseph (NOT the same one as in Mary and Joseph) in our story at Footsteps. He was the second youngest of 12 brothers but was considered 'special' by his father and given a multicoloured coat to wear. This didn't go down well with his brothers who sold him as a slave and he ended up being taken to Egypt. This I'm sure you'll agree is

slightly extreme compared to a bit of bedroom door slamming and suggestions that you shouldn't talk to them until at least tea time. Joseph worked hard in Egypt and was promoted to a prominent position within the household of Pharaoh (the Egyptian king). On Joseph's advice Egypt had made preparations in case of disaster and when a famine (food shortage) came they had plenty of food left and were able to sell it to people from other countries. Joseph's brothers came to buy grain but didn't realise that the man who was selling it to them was the brother they had sold to be a slave. He recognised them and they were reunited. It didn't go entirely smoothly but in the end they made up and Joseph met his father who had thought he was dead. It was a happy ending but shows the importance of when things do go wrong being able to say sorry and make-up.

The quiz was based on Egypt and colours. Some of the questions were really tricky - like how many pyramids are there in Egypt? Sources vary, but the official quiz adjudicator (Google, other search engines are available) suggested between 118 and 138.

The family challenge was to build a pyramid -

there was much debate about whether a square or triangular base was best and if using a cardboard box or tubes would make it more stable. All the structures looked really good and they were moved over into church for the Sunday morning service.

After the challenge we moved through into the hall for crafts and games. There was a cake to decorate with

multicoloured icing, lots of colourful cards and hangers to make and a cross mounted on a wooden board to remind us that 'God forgives'. Skittles, bean bags and marbles provided alternative activities and things got quite competitive with people wanting 'one last go' to try and get better scores. A special congratulations to one of the girls, she managed to balance 25 sugar lumps on a lolly stick held between her teeth! Wow!

The afternoon finished with tea - no famine here - we enjoyed sandwiches, crisps, cheese squares, sausage rolls, cakes and ice cream (there were also cucumber, tomato and tangerine pieces for anyone who was interested!). When you were a very small baby you might have slept in a Moses basket but who was Moses and why is a baby's cot named after him?




There are lots of stories about Moses in the Bible but the one we heard at TLC was when he was a baby.

- Read more




Do you think anyone ever makes a promise to talk more?! Before we think a bit more about that, do you know which of the following statements are true?


- Both men and women say around 16,000 words a day.
