The Readings.

Luke 24:45-53

⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. ⁴⁶ He told them, “This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷ and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹ I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.”

The Ascension of Jesus

⁵⁰ When he had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, he lifted up his hands and blessed them. ⁵¹ While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up into heaven. ⁵² Then they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. ⁵³ And they stayed continually at the temple, praising God.

Acts1:1-11, Jesus Taken Up Into Heaven

1 In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach² until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. ³ After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. ⁴ On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. ⁵ For John baptized with^[a] water, but in a few days you will be baptized with^[b] the Holy Spirit."

⁶ Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"

⁷ He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

⁹ After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight.

¹⁰ They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. ¹¹ "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

The Sermon.

The Acts of the Apostles is the second book written by Luke. The first an account of all the things Jesus did, and taught, right up to the Ascension.

The appearances of Jesus to his disciples over a period of forty days, the eating, the conversations, the invitation to touch him to verify his 'body' gave confirmation to the apostles of his validity as the Son of God. We should consider too, that his ability to simply disappear, must have given some disturbing validity to his Divinity. This man can cross two worlds.

In the same surprising way that Jesus enters the world, He leaves it! His work beginning in Bethlehem in human birth, is finished, and his ascension to His father a mighty statement of closure. However, his promise is to be with them always. His instruction is left with them to stay and wait for what His Father is to give them. He will equip them to take out the Gospel message from there in Jerusalem to the far ends of the earth! Until they have been "clothed with power from on high" (Luke 24v 49)

Acts builds on what Jesus has already spoken of, it's a book which begins with the work of the early disciples, but this book is special because there is in a sense no ending, because all Jesus began was carried on by the disciples, throughout the early Christian Church, to our world today, and if you like, Jesus has the book and the accounts of the witness to him, which are so vast that there is, and can be no ending till the 'last day'.

We remember people in history that have made their mark on the world, like Martin Luther King, Einstein, Florence Nightingale and many more. How they lived their lives is recorded and lives on. But they don't!

Jesus is not the one who was! He is the one who IS and still His life goes on !!!

The Jews always knew they were special. They took that to mean that one day their specialness and supremacy would be restored, and their supremacy would be worldwide. The thing is their misunderstanding of the Kingdom of which Jesus spoke of. They were looking for earthly honours and power. Jesus spoke of a power which is nothing to with this world, nor with politics. It belongs to God. If only we could get this message out to the world now!

Christianity is not a religion of the West, or East, North or South. It is a power in the whole world that has been there since the beginning of the world. Jesus is the key to help us understand that, and to those who follow him, being given access to that power in His name to fulfill His Mission in the world today! Only the Son of the Living God has authority to do this. No false prophets or authorities can stand against the power that He will give to his

disciples! By our deeds we will be seen and known when we follow the path He sets for us. Love is the one thing that can defeat the evil in our world. It is the unbroken link between Heaven and earth. Jesus is the link, and we can see that through the Ascension. His restoration to His Father in the Kingdom.

The angels' appearance at the Ascension tells us too that He will return in the same way that He left. The second coming is the essential story of an event still to happen. It's a summons to prepare ourselves for what will happen. It is part of God's plan that this will happen and that our world is heading for it.

In Luke 24,v52 we hear of the disciples returning to Jerusalem with "great joy" following the Ascension! Not as they were after the Crucifixion. A jubilant bunch, knowing that Jesus was not lost to them, but that He was with them forever.!

Can you feel that optimism in his Holy Word too?

The apostles were told to wait on the coming of the Spirit. In the business of life we need to learn to be still.

" They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength"(Isaiah 40: 31.

Amidst all the striving there must be a time to receive! Amen!

Reflections.

a) We have listened to the fact that Jesus was able to appear in a human way, and disappear in a very Divine way. How do you feel about that? Does it take you beyond your comfort zone, and challenge you to accept that with Jesus there is a new 'reality'!

b) Have you ever joined in with a group of people watching something in the sky? Were your eyes so fixed that you never thought to look at who you were standing next to?

c) The disciples were undoubtedly shocked to see two angels who spoke with them. It's an amusing scene when you think about it, the angels ask them why they are looking up to heaven, watching Jesus go, rather as if they are saying 'this is normal.. get used to it!?' Don't waste time standing here...off you go!!! Is that message spoken to us too?
