### **The Great Commission**

<sup>16</sup> Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. <sup>17</sup> When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. <sup>18</sup> Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

### **Sermon / reflection on scripture**

In Matthew's account of what we have come to call 'the Great Commission' the disciples are in Galilee. This feels like a continuation from the account in John last week where the disciples had gone to Galilee and were fishing. Last week they met Jesus by the sea shore this week they are on a mountain where Jesus and we recall that Jesus had told them to go there. They were expecting to meet with Jesus and this account talks of just the 11 disciples. That core group of men who had followed Jesus for the last 3 years.

When they see Jesus there are two responses worship and doubt. When our eyes are opened and we see Jesus how can we respond other than in worship? That word can also be translated as fall down, or kneel down. When the disciples saw Jesus they bowed down in awe and wonder. But there was also a hesitancy amongst some of the disciples. I wonder what thoughts were going through their heads? They had seen Jesus raise others from the dead. They had been there when Lazarus walked out of the tomb but this was different. Since His resurrection they had seen Jesus at least three times but in all the accounts there is some sense of uncertainty, or initially lack of recognition of Jesus. Was this Jesus? Had he really risen from the dead. Was He the Messiah, God's anointed one who they had been waiting for to bring salvation?

Then Jesus comes to them. Isn't that a wonderful picture of how, when we approach the Lord in worship He draws us closer into His presence. Then He speaks and as if to counter their doubts says 'All authority has been given to me in Heaven and in earth'. He confirms in one sentence that yes, He is God's anointed one, and as the Son of God He carries God's authority.

He continues with the word 'therefore'. Because Jesus carries all authority He can instruct His followers to go and make disciples. This is their commission, their life purpose! Not to be important or rich but to go and make disciples, baptise them and teach them. There is nothing passive about this – 'go' and 'make' are active verbs. They are to do more than make disciples though, they are to baptise them. That word means 'immerse'. They are to immerse them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. There is a significant point

here though. The disciples have not yet themselves been immersed in the Holy Spirit and perhaps that is part of the doubt. They need to be immersed before they can immerse others.

They are to teach them to obey everything Jesus has commanded them. The command that springs to my mind is from John 13:34-35: "A new command I give you: Love one another as I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." What a powerful message to leave them with.

Jesus reassures them though that they don't have to do this by themselves. He will be with them and we now know that is through the power of the Holy Spirit.

### **Reflection**

What is our response when we see Jesus? Do we fall down in worship? What does our worship look like? Or do we have doubts? Bring those doubts to God in prayer now.

What do we see as our purpose in life? Do we see our purpose as making disciples? What does that look like for you as an individual? Spend some time in prayer asking God to show you how He is calling you to live out your purpose in Him.

We can't pass on what we don't have. Are you immersed in the Holy Spirit? How are you using this time during lock down to draw closer to God and to ask Him to prepare you for what the next season will look like.

Jesus instructed the disciples to teach others to obey everything He had commanded them. One of the best ways to teach is by example. What sort of example do we demonstrate as current day disciples of Jesus?

Jesus commanded his disciples to love one another as He had loved them. How do we demonstrate that love during this season of lockdown?

If you have been challenged by this reflection remember – you are not walking this pathway alone Jesus promises that He will be with us until the very end of the age.

### **Prayer**

We praise you and we bless you, our risen Lord Jesus, King of glory,  
for you took the risk of passing your mission to frail disciples.

As you commissioned them to go into all the world,  
so may all the world come to you, the King of nations.

To you, Lord Jesus,  
with us to the end of the age,  
be honour and glory, now and for ever.  
Amen.
